



We trust that receipt of the magazine each month has in some way played a part in getting through what has been a most demanding past twelve months for many of us. Hopefully, better times are ahead of us in 2022.

The renewal of your **Annual Subscription** was due in **January** and has reverted back to the pre-pandemic rate of £6 for twelve copies. Your local distributor will collect the money, cash being preferable, but cheques are also acceptable. The price for postal copies has increased to £18, reflecting the current Second-Class large letter rate ,together with the cost of the magazine.

All cheques payable to 'Hartford Hundred West Parish Magazine' We thank you for your ongoing support and wish you well in 2022.

So, what do we do with all of the monies?

ot an unreasonable question to be asked by one of our new advertisers, but one I hadn't been faced with before. In the spirit of openness and accountability, I have no hesitation in sharing with our readers where the monies come in from and how this is then spent.

Our two principal sources of income come from our 500 readers and their annual subscriptions - £6 this year and from our 50 plus local businesses advertising their services within the parishes. We also receive a number of donations from our subscribers, for which we are very grateful. Now that interest rates are so low, interest on our deposit monies is negligible - 79p in the last calendar quarter of 2021! Turning to our expenditure, we aim to cover the cost of having the magazine each month bv printed subscriptions received, but this is proving challenging this year against the backdrop of rising prices wherever you look. We also make some small ongoing contributions to the costs of running the Parish Office.

Surpluses have been accumulated over the past few years, primarily from the advertising monies received. and have been held in our bank deposit account until such time that deserving causes have been identified to make best use of these hard earnt monies. Last year we made equal distributions to each of the four Parochial Church Councils (PCCs), to bolster their income which had been hit hard during the Covid pandemic. We have also just made a significant donation to the Ukraine Appeal through the Disasters Emergency Committee (DEC) - please separate article from our Editor.

Full accounts are prepared each year, which in turn are examined by our Independent Examiner before being placed before the Parish Magazine Team for adoption at our annual meeting.

Hopefully, this article will assure our readers that all financial contributions received, however small, are put to good use in furthering the needs of all of our parishioners in whichever way we can.

Anne Mitcheson

45 years ago, Anne and George Mitcheson moved into Farmleigh in Berkhamsted shortly Lane and ioined afterwards thev the congregation of St Mary's Essendon. Anne still tells of the warm welcome they received on that first visit. The need to welcome and be interested in newcomers and regulars alike has been a constant theme of Anne's, and rarely has she not been a welcoming presence at the door.

In 1990 Anne became deputy Churchwarden and three years later, Churchwarden, forming a formidable team with Molly Freak, and subsequently with Beresford Thomson and now with Paul Wombwell: three decades of highly successful, amicable teamwork.

When the Mitchesons first arrived, St Mary's was facing an enormous challenge. The condition of the roof had been ignored for too long and the Parish faced an emergency. George led the call for action and with others started a restoration campaign to raise the considerable money needed. Importantly, following its success, The Friends of St Mary's was set up to build on this and provide funds for future projects.

Anne and George continued to support the Church financially (much of it anonymously), and to give their time and energy over many years. They both strongly supported many aspects of Essendon village life.

The first major challenge for Anne as Churchwarden came with the retirement of the Reverend John Cotton. Anne has always preferred action to meditation. Anne, together with the other churchwardens, tried

to set up a meeting with the Patron, the previous Marquis of Salisbury, but all to no avail. Eventually the Bishop "suspended the living" to allow John's curate. Pauline Higham, to become Priest in Charge. And thereby was achieved a smooth transition for Pauline to become our new Priest-incharge (later to be Rector). The link hetween Parish Priest Churchwarden is a vital one, and the loyalty and support Anne provided Reverend Pauline contributed to the well-being of St Mary's and its community for many years. Anne has been able to offer similar support to Reverend Theresa during the last two vears.

The second major challenge for Anne came with the PCC's decision to build a church room. This was an extremely fraught and draining episode in our Church's life, particularly for the Churchwardens and the Rector, Anne and Reverend Pauline's determination kept our spirits up when the project seemed doomed. Importantly, Anne reminded those of us involved in the project to remember that the opposition were our neighbours and members of the community. village She determined to remain on good terms with everyone despite heightened passions.

The third major challenge was Reverend Pauline's retirement. St Mary's owes Anne, supported by Paul, an enormous debt of gratitude for the maintenance of the Church's life during the ensuing vacancy. All the Churchwardens came together during this time, working and becoming a strong team; Anne was a leading light

in this Group and together they ensured that not one service was missed during the vacancy. Additionally, she, with two other members of our congregation, having previously trained as Lay Leaders of Worship, served all the Churches in our Group. Regularly giving a talk as a substitute for the sermon was not a role Anne would have envisaged when agreeing to be a Churchwarden all those years before. (In fact, the only job in Church life that Anne has refused is to join the flower roster).

There is so much to remember about the many ways in which Anne has carried out her duties: she has been a loyal and supportive friend to three Rectors; she has focused tirelessly in involving as many people as possible in the activities of the church; she has ensured no special anniversaries in

congregations have been our forgotten: she has given sterling support to the parish magazine editor. Visitors to Gardens Open Day have gone away with plants dug up on the spot from Farmleigh garden; weeds have been kept at bay in the churchvard: church heating checked hefore services and service books set out ready. Many individuals and families have known her friendship and generosity. She has sat by the ill and dying and visited the bereaved. In one person, Anne has personified the church's outreach.

Practical, rural Christianity, based on kindness and a keen sense of duty, a worshipper in the traditional Church of England all her life: Anne, we salute you, thank you, and wish you many happy years in your new home.

Essendon Nature Notes

It is our good fortune that for the last three years the first cuckoos of the spring recorded in Hertfordshire have been in Essendon or Wildhill. The cuckoo, arriving in mid-April, is one of our later migrants but also one of the first to depart, not surprising, given that it leaves others to do its parental duties. The cuckoo is famous for its habit of laying its egg in a host's nest and each female has a favoured species whose egg it mimics. Cuckoos are involved in an evolutionary arms race as the host gets better at identifying rogue eggs and the cuckoo, like an art-world forger, gets better at producing convincing replica colourations to match the original. The which are the hest eggs counterfeits are those for which the species has been parasitising the longest and the most favoured are dunnock, meadow pipit and reed warbler.

The young cuckoo chick rolls the host's eggs out of the nest on its back and once it has completed this instinctively murderous act, the stage is set for the single cuckoo chick to monopolise the attention of its duped

foster parents and it quickly dwarfs them in size.

Despite its unusual family habits it remains one of our most loved birds. The golf course in Essendon has been a regular haunt for the last few years and it is probably the most reliable place locally to see and hear them. As it perches calling on a branch it characteristically drops its wings below its tail. The cuckoo itself is a mimic of the sparrowhawk appearance, assisting it no doubt in flushing unsuspecting victims from their nests when looking to lay and adding to the mystery of this unusual bird.

There is nothing quite as unmistakeable as the cuckoo's call but it is easy to understand why the word cuckoo has come to be associated with madness given the relentlessness of its two-note refrain. So if you are having a pint in the garden of The Woodman this month, listen out for this iconic harbinger of spring but don't let it drive you to drink.

Our evening's talk was entitled 'Gardeners and Gardenina in Literature'. Hazel Bell read introductory and explanatory notes between exerts, read by Diana Holt, from a variety of different INSPIRING WOMEN books about gardeners and gardening. The exerts were arranged chronologically starting with Adam in the garden of Eden and a reading from the book of Genesis. Little is written on gardening before the 14th century, but the selection of readings (prose and poetry) illustrated the differing methods and trends through the centuries, the gardeners' gifts and styles, their favourite flowers and plants, and their love of gardening in general. Gardens of many designs were described from wilderness to the palatial as many gardeners (often ladies) were aristocratic or well-off people. Books from which the readings had come were on display, many by well-known authors such as Beatrix Potter (who described Camfield Place as the place she loved best in the world and which inspired some of her books), RL Stevenson, Vita Sackville West and Pam Ayres. The peace and enjoyment to be gained from gardening was very evident.

Gardening in April

The sun is shining but still no proper winter temperatures, strong winds and heavy rains and I hope that we won't pay for this in the months ahead. Assuming things will be reasonably normal, start sowing vegetable, herb and annual flower seeds both indoors and outdoors. Feed the now 'dying back' Spring bulbs which have been wonderful this year. Look after them both by gently raking and feeding the soil round them but also by using a 'foliar feed' spray on the leaves. Don't be tempted to 'tie up' or remove the Daffodil leaves as they will die back in their own time.

Have a good look at your climbing and rambler roses, tying in any good new stems that will give them a good horizontal shape for their main flowering. Do use good 'protected' ties for this so these fresh shoots grow on well.

Hardy annual flower seeds sown a few weeks ago will need 'thinning'. If you are careful you can rescue the best of of these 'rejects' and plant them elsewhere later on.

Lawns will benefit from an application of the right fertiliser but chose this carefully to maintain the correct balance of lawn nutrients. Continue to feed the birds and to enjoy all that is going on around you!





A Chapter Closes at Ponsbourne

Michael (Mike) Sutcliffe, who sadly passed away recently, will be remembered for a lifetime of service to the community in many, often unsung, ways. He was for instance a Churchwarden of St. Mary's, Ponsbourne for 50 years, during which time he served eight incumbents and assorted curates - some of whom went on to be incumbents - (but only four organists!).

As an often-consulted source of advice and expertise his involvement with the other parishes in the Group was invaluable. There is not space here for a full list but his work included contributions to projects such as the Tower at Essendon, the internal refurbishment of Little Berkhamsted and investigations into the roof and the churchyard wall at Bayford.

Ponsbourne projects included repairs to the roof of the Nave, the Chancel and Vestry, the conversion of the South Transept to a meeting/coffee space and refurbishment of the Organ Chamber as part of the overall Organ Restoration project.

During National Service, he served in the Royal Engineers (and years later could still remember and demonstrate some of the army drill commands and actions to a rapt Family Service congregation). Training as an architect followed, enabling his involvement in a wide variety of projects and also, importantly, many years of mentoring and examining aspiring entrants into the profession.

His professional background meant that he could and did converse with contractors and regulatory bodies with authority. Local examples of his work include the block of flats at the eastern end of French Horn Lane in Hatfield, and the circular enclave of flatlets near the south end of the Digswell Viaduct in Welwyn Garden City (probably best seen from a passing train). His ability to devise ingenious constructions included the garden outbuilding which made maximum use of full-size sheets of plywood, thus minimising effort in cutting smaller pieces to size.

With a marriage lasting some 60 years, his achievements were supported in no small measure by his wife Gillian, his offspring, and in due course also their families.

In recent years, he continued to work for a variety of clients, despite severe challenges to his health, and functioned as both churchwarden and treasurer for the parish. It is to be regretted that the church authorities to whom he had given much support for many years were found wanting when a few ignorant but arrogant individuals were a cause of much strain and distress for a time.

His "family" within the church must now adapt to his absence: others must now be found to greet arrivals, read lessons and take collections. His own family are of course grieving themselves but being amazingly strong and resilient are already putting plans in place for the next stages of their lives.

Thomas Michael (Mike) Sutcliffe – Well done, thou faithful servant. Now rest in peace.






