Rector's Article.

According to the gospel of Matthew chapter 28, the risen Lord appeared to his disciples at a mountain. His sufferings were over, because He lived, they too would live. In His glorious body he stood before them. They worshipped Him, though some doubted.

I quite like what Jesus explained to them that all authority in heaven and earth had been given to Him. (Matt 28:18) This is after He had suffered and conquered death, Most of us agree that He always had authority, but here He was speaking of the authority of the head of the new creation since His death and resurrection. He had now completed the work of redemption.

Jesus, the Head of the new creation as the gospel unfolds in chapter 28, issued the Great Commission, containing Standing Orders for all believers:

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations. By preaching the gospels the disciples were seeing others becoming learners or followers of Christ from every nation, tribe and tongue.

- Baptize them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Here the responsibility rests with the disciples to teach and baptism. In baptism believers identifies themselves with the Trinity. They acknowledge God the Father, Jesus and the Holy Spirit publicly.
- Teach them to observe all things I

have commanded you.

The Commission is about Evangelism. It is about going out, proclaiming the good news that He is alive. Telling our stories to others and encouraging them. Most assuredly Jesus added a promise of His Presence with His disciples until the end of the age. I take comfort in the words. They would not go forth unaided. In all our services we have the companionship of the Holy Spirit.

For the disciples to be endued and filled by the Spirit of God, Jesus told them to wait in Jerusalem. Yes, the fulfilment would occur in Jerusalem (Acts 1:4) the very city where the Saviour had been crucified. The presence of the Spirit bears witness. Let us not give up no matter what happens to us. His presence is with us. Paul charges Timothy his son in Christ to "do the work of an evangelist". (Tim 4:5).

Inspired by the Holy Spirit may we continue to live God's love through the five marks of mission: proclaiming the Good News of the gospel; teaching, baptising, nurturing new believers, seeking to transform unjust structures of society, challenging violence of every kind pursuing peace and reconciliation, lastly striving to safeguard the integrity of creation.



I Switched!





Following year-on-year price increases misleading 'special offers', we decided to bite the bullet and, not without

some trepidation, switch our ISP (broadband supplier).

When looking at broadband deals take note of the contract length. This is usually 18 months. To leave early you will have to pay a fee, related to the lost revenue. You also have to be careful as many deals will increase in price during the contract. The special deal may only last a few months.

You don't have to change mobile and broadband supplier. You can each with a separate company.

If you switch your mobile, in order to keep your mobile number you need to get a PAC code from your present supplier. This is fairly straightforward. You just follow an online link and sometime later, an email appears with the code. (numbers and letters). Keep this in a safe place as you will need it later. This code however has an expiry ready. The request will notify your supplier that you intend to switch so you may get offers from them, to entice you to stay.

Next decide which ISP you are going to switch to for broadband and landline. In fact, you don't really need a landline. We decided to include a landline as so many people had the number. You will be able to keep your old landline number. The present landline system (analogue) will close down in December 2025. After that all

telephone conversations will go via the internet. Some people already have internet (VOIP/DECT) telephones. They connect (by WIFI) to your Hub (the box your



telephone line is connected to), so they can be anywhere in the house. The disadvantage is that they don't work in a power cut.

The speech is transmitted via the internet, just like Zoom calls. If you don't have broadband, most suppliers will install it and give you an adapter for your current handsets. This might be free or charged.

I worry where the swallows will assemble in Autumn before flying south, if there are no telephone wires!

Prior to the date of the switch, you will received a new Hub. Just plug it into the wall phone line using the small filter (matchbox sized box) you used with the old Hub.

The new WIFI Hub will have a new name and password, usually written on the back and printed on the handbook. date, so don't request it until you are You will have to enter this into your mobile phone, tablet, television etc to connect them to the internet...

> In conclusion I can report it all went fairly smoothly. By mistake I plugged in the new hub before the given date. so I had to plug the old hub back in.

> On the day the new broadband was up and running in a couple of hours. MW

Ladies of the WI will be entertaining Mary Smith on Wednesday 17th **April at 8.00 p.m**. in the Village Hall. Mary will be recalling to us that her aunt and uncle, Tony and Ray Jones, used to live in Essendon at a house called Northfield and a school friend's father, Mr. Crowley, farmed at Cucumber Hall Farm.

She will be travelling from Maidstone and talking about "A Schoolgirl's War", an account of how girls attending Maidstone Girls Grammar School had to deal with the challenges of their schooling during the Second World War. The talk will also feature illustrations of a unique set of paintings which reveal school life during the Battle of Britain and the doodlebug attacks.

There will be no speaker at Essendon WI in the Village Hall on Wednesday 8th May, as the Annual General Meeting is being held. However, after the business side of the meeting, at around 8.30 pm, some board games will be organised and hotly contested by a bunch of competitive ladies. GARDENING in APRIL

As I write this after a very wet, early and mainly mild start to Spring, it is difficult to plan too far ahead in case we are later 'tripped up' by this advance! Particularly, we must make sure that we don't 'trample' our gardens if it remains so wet.

Trim frost-damaged or untidy lavender plants avoiding cutting into old wood as it won't re-grow and 'dead-head' faded Daffodil and Tulip flowers, both the heads and seedpods. Remove unwanted suckers from the base of trees and shrubs such as Magnolias and Roses, tearing them off if you can as close to the ground as possible. Remove faded blooms on Primroses, Pansies and other Spring-flowering plants to encourage more blooms.

First and second early seed potatoes can be planted from early to mid-April and just hope that there won't be any nasty late frosts. Get on top of the weeds now and it will be a big help later in the year and thoroughly dig out perennial weeds wherever you can. Continue sowing all your usual favourite vegetables in wellprepared soil. Among any of your perennial plants which have been overrun by weeds, dig them up carefully taking plenty of soil, tease out the weeds, sometimes from the bottom, then return the plant to its original position and give it a good soak! This is a good time to buy and plant out young perennial plants which can be bought quite cheaply as small plants and will quickly fill out and flourish so keep an eye open for them!

Start sowing vegetables outdoors and plant early potatoes. When it happens remember to open the vents in your greenhouses on warm days and to shut them if there are overnight frost warnings!
