

Roadmap to re-opening the Baker Arms

With the pub now listed as an Asset of Community Value (ACV), and a meeting with McMullen & Sons indicating their openness to sale, the coming months will see our roadmap take shape. There are milestones on the way: establishing the site valuation, our vision and business plan, identifying potential partners, setting a fundraising plan and target, and formalising a legal structure (we're considering proven democratic models like Community Benefit Society and Community Interest Company).

Friends in all the right places

We're not going it alone! An application has been lodged with the Plunkett Foundation, a charity that offers help and professional advice to groups in rural areas seeking to acquire and run community- owned businesses. We're also hearing from other community pub groups, like the Red Lion in Aston who have recently opened under community ownership. Some great people have offered to help – we'd love to hear from anyone else who has expertise in community engagement, the planning system, development and construction, fundraising and food and drink.

Consultation survey shapes vision for Community Pub

We've received close to 200 responses - thank you! These show an amazing 96% support level for having a pub in Bayford. A clear vision for the site is emerging: a safe and welcoming place for people to meet and socialise, and also a community hub; offering perhaps a cafe a shop and practicalities such as a

parcel point. It could also give life to new dreams – great ideas have come forward like a repair cafe, dementia support and fostering connection with nature through walking and cycling groups. All these ideas will need nurturing, but just now it's exciting to think big! The survey remains open at the website.

County Councillor Musings. Ken Crofton

September's Parish magazine spurred me to offer an update on a few County Council (HCC) issues. I will start by saying that HCC is a huge operation employing 8000 people funded from government grants, the Local Enterprise Partnership and Council tax payers totalling £1.15 billion. In a county where demands from the public are ever increasing and income difficult to increase there is pressure on the finance director and his team to balance the books whilst maintaining services. The massive increase in the costs of children's services of over £1 million a day, adult care and inflation have had an impact.

HCC has an enviable record nationally and at Whitehall of being well run and respected and is used as an exemplar for other County Councils to follow.

The Magazine mentioned that staff at County Hall are being relocated to Robertson House in Gunnels Wood Road, Stevenage, this is the County Council not East Herts Council as some believe. Our chief executive Mr. Owen Mapley has encouraged home working and determined that the offices are now not populated enough to warrant the expenditure as he believes they are too large for current needs.

Robertson House will be known to many as the location where the Covid jabs were administered. This is a vast building owned by HCC and is being prepared to receive the new influx of staff from December. HCC meetings will still be held in the magnificent chamber at County Hall. No decision has been made what to do with the back offices whether they may be rented out or planning permission sought for housing. Once a decision has been made it will be impossible to reverse it. It is unrealistic to imagine there will be cost savings.

I have to tell you I have and will continue to oppose this short-sighted abandonment of County Hall. Our CEO is mistaken to believe that whilst the rest of the country is understanding the need to return to the place of work, Councils fail to understand that to provide an efficient service the workforce need to be managed and staff trained and communicate together. With a 10% staff churn new employees tend to be younger and often work from a rented flat or their parents' home. It must be a horrible working environment without the benefit of companionship or proper communication.

In my opinion this inefficient working from home should be ended immediately and staff made to repopulate the offices at County Hall, after all it is the County Town.

I have written to the Rt Hon Michael Gove to ask him to compel Councils to get back to work. It is surprising there hasn't been more of an outcry from residents or the local press.

Oak Processionary Moths

Unfortunately there is a problem in the Churchyard with oak moths nests. These nasty creatures are found across the southeast – including Hertfordshire. The caterpillars feed on the leaves of oak trees causing stress to the tree making them more susceptible to disease and drought.

Older caterpillars have hundreds of tiny hairs which can cause skin rashes, eye irritation, breathing difficulties. We are taking this very seriously and are getting expert help and advice.





Gardening in December

Gardening, whether on a large or small scale, is always so dependent on the right weather and over these recent months both we and our gardens, whether they are large or small, have been put to the test! Some results could be described as inevitable, some unexpected and, best of all, many a delight so don't ever give up!

It has been a remarkable season for the Dahlia and it depends very much on the soil as to whether you lift them or just carefully cut them back and cover them and leave them in place for next year and I certainly, by mistake, had a very tall one right at the front and I must mark it to consider moving it in the Spring if I don't winter it 'inside'.

Those of you that love Hellebores, very carefully go through them cutting last season's growth to ground level which will gently reveal new flower stems and this will also keep the 'blotchy leaf spot' at bay – be sure to collect up all the old leaves and dispose of them carefully.

If the weather is fit, keep planting Tulips to extend their season but remember to mark where you have put them in if not in pots.

Prune deciduous shrubs, removing a few branches at ground level. Trim apples and pears, cutting out dead, diseased and damaged wood and opening up the shape. Start 'forcing' Rhubarb either outside or in the greenhouse – you can do this by using either an upturned big terracotta pot or an upturned dustbin!

If there are any spare areas of your vegetable garden apply well-rotted manure and gently fork it in and the earthworms should do the rest and improve both the texture and the fertility

Plants on your patios in tubs and pots need a careful eye as the temperatures drop and this can affect the compost because of its moisture content and the roots can freeze and die back – you can prevent this by wrapping the pots in several layers of old sacking or fleece and they should survive all but extreme temperatures. Happy Christmas!
