bear All Thankfulness is an attitude of the heart. There are various words that can be used to describe thankfulness, such as gratitude or appreciation. With thankfulness, we often reflect back on things which have occurred in our life or the lives of others. In moments of reflection, if we look back at good moments or situations that might have

occurred, a feeling of gratitude starts building up within us and can often be expressed in a variety of ways such as word, action or song.

It has been scientifically proven that the effects of gratitude on the heart and brain are vastly different to those cultivated when in a

state of stress. In cultivating gratitude, the heart has smooth rhythms and the body comes into a greater state of homeostasis. Whereas in stress states such as frustration the heart rhvthms become more erratic and it becomes more difficult for the brain to think coherently. The importance of thankfulness can clearly be seen from the science as well as the bible. Apostle encouraged believers Paul in Ephesians 5: 19-20 'speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual sinaina sonas. and making melody in your heart to the Lord, giving thanks always for all things to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ', He emphasised how

we should be thankful to God in all circumstances.

It can be difficult to cultivate thankfulness during hardships. The feeling of gratitude can seem like a contradiction to how we feel inside. 



Essendon Nature Notes

Having come down this morning to see a fresh dead rabbit on the lawn I wondered which opportunists would be first on the scene. A pair of magpies duly obliged and, as is their macabre habit, they took the eyes. A couple of jays clacked around excitedly and a mewing buzzard kept a watch on proceedings from the old oak. When I returned a little later the carcass was gone. As it was daylight I doubt the foxes were up and about so I suspect the red kites had taken it.

In the Middle Ages the kites were welcomed for the benefit of their scavenging in cleaning up the foul cities but in later times persecution to protect game on estate land brought them to the edge of extinction in the UK. There was only two or three sightings in Hertfordshire through the whole of the nineteenth century. I saw my first kite in mid-Wales at a time when they were clinging on in their last stronghold so it was really something to see the first reintroduced pairs above the beech woods of the Chilterns, some thirty years ago now. The explosion in their numbers since then has been dramatic and they are a daily sight above Essendon's fields as they search for carrion - the presence of this marvellous raptor over the past decades is a wonderful success story. It perhaps says something about our modern way of life that this bird is now flourishing due to the food provided by the large numbers of creatures killed on our roads and it can't be long before they are taking advantage of the rich pickings of city life like their counterparts from centuries ago.

The red kite is easily told apart from the buzzard by its giveaway forked tail and they are amazingly graceful as they float effortlessly on the breeze. The playing fields in Essendon are a great place to watch them tumble and turn but if you see one majestic at rest they are truly magnificent with their red plumage and pale head. They like to renovate old buzzard nests and there are recent stories of them using all sorts of contraband to line them with. This doesn't appear to be a new trick - Shakespeare's The Winter's Tale gives the warning 'When the kite builds, look to lesser linen', so when you are hanging out your washing this spring, first check the skies or you might be missing a few items. Gardening in February

On January 2nd the first Aconite appeared so it has beaten the Snowdrops this year and brought a bit of cheer to the very variable weather. Both aconites and snowdrops flourish in clumps but these need splitting and now, unusually, is the time to carefully lift them and replant and do this whilst they are flowering. The very early short pretty light purple Iris, always known here as 'Mary Stansfeld' after that wonderful gardener in Wild Hill, is in full bloom but what extraordinary weather we are having! Have a good look at your herbaceous perennials, removing old growth and letting the new shoots through and keep 'dead heading' your winter pansies to encourage continuous flowering. If you are a Dahlia lover set up your tubers in a shallow tray of potting compost and put them in a warm, light place to encourage them to shoot and, once they have reached a good inch of healthy growth, take a sharp knife, and divide the tubers, pot them up and just make sure they avoid the cold.

Prune your autumn-fruiting raspberries, cutting them down to ground level and apply a general -purpose fertiliser. Keep feeding the birds and make sure they always have water and finish your winter pruning in good time remembering that birds will be starting to nest in March.




