# Pear All Celebration of Platinum Jubilee

As expected, the Platinum Jubilee weekend from 2-5th June 2022 was an extremely joyous occasion across the whole country. Nationally it was a four day Bank Holiday for everyone. The largest celebrations were in London. In London, there were events such as a fly past and a concert which was attended by most people from all walks of life. This was a truly international event, with tributes coming from all corners of the globe. A special mention needs to be made for one of our very own musicians who took part in this event, George Ezra from Brickendon, He sang beautifully two songs at that concert.

Our five communities did not disappoint in the arrangement of celebrations for that weekend. Varying activities were held in each of the five communities. In Little Berkhamsted there was a flower festival in St. Andrew's Church led by Sandie Ash where different flower arrangements were displayed. At the Pavilion there astonishing events: activities, music, BBQ and lighting of a beacon at the end. People loved every moment.

In **Essendon**, there were wonderful different activities at the playing field and in the village each day: music and dancing, picnics, community coffee mornings, family gatherings, competitions, etc. Each day people from all age groups attended in great numbers. Indeed we saw great things

in Essendon!

To honour Her Majesty, the Queen, The Hartford Hundred West Group Church held a significant Group Service on the Pentecost Sunday morning Essendon. There was a Group choir led by Katie Nelson with 35 people including children from all the 5 communities. All organists in the group participated. In addition to the hymns, they sang the Jubilee song (Rise up and Serve) and the National Anthem. People cheered and clapped and some had tears running down their faces. Someone who attended the group service at Essendon said. "The choir was wonderful and the prayer that was read whilst the choir was singing was incredibly special". There was a sense of unity and joy.

It was also awesome in **Bayford**. There was a community picnic, a BBQ and a steel band on the green opposite the Baker Arms. I saw most of the village people coming out. People I had never met before. The Jubilee choir from the 5 communities also sang the Jubilee song and touching speeches were given. Bayford community displayed a welcoming and inclusive atmosphere.

Ponsborne was not to be left out. Under the skilful leadership of Jo, over 100 people assembled outside the Village Hall for a picnic, the unveiling of the plaque and later, various competitions in the field. I participated in one of the games (Egg Race) unfortunately I did not win. People mingled and chatted joyfully. A community spirit was there.

**Brickendon** met on the Village Green on Sunday afternoon for a lovely

picnic. People attended in numbers, chatting and sharing food. There was an amazing performance from a singer for entertainment. Later we sang happy Birthday to John L. People enjoyed the singing. Brickendon showed love for each other.

All what was done was to thank God and appreciate the dedication to duty that the Queen has shown over the country throughout her reign. Thank you all! There have been many victorious times and challenges over the years. We all have a lot to learn from the Queen. Times of celebration like this are refreshing after facing many difficulties over the past few years; with the most recent being the start of the war in Ukraine.

#### Adventure for Dementia.

#### Westward Ho! Sunday 8th May

Our adventure for dementia continues; walking the whole SW Coastal Path for Alzheimer's Society and Alzheimer's research for my mum.

You may remember her, Margaret ran the flower Rota for Essendon church for several years, helped out at the Sunday Club and helped on numerous village days and open gardens. My sister and I were also married at Essendon church and had our children christened there.

#### Hello from Plymouth in week 6.

We have walked 410 miles along the N Dorset & Devon coastlines and all around Cornwall; just 220 miles and 29 days left. Our country is stunningly beautiful, I don't think we realise how lovely it. We are still alive, definitely weary, with creaky joints and sore ankles! We have been checked up on, joined by family and friends.

We have stayed in surfers digs (too old), YHA hostels (time warp from the 50s), Airbnb studio apartments (washing machine!!!), people's spare rooms (so kind to let our kids sleep too), guest houses (generously donating the second night) and luxury bnbs (my husbands favourite - the breakfasts!)

Day 23 There was some level walking, especially as we descended into Sennen cove, with its lovely beaches. We walked the steps repaired by our



BnB host and saw the bay, from the salt path.

Replenished with tea and cake we took the scenic path to Lands' End. We had our official photo taken before heading in land to the hostel.

Day 27 "Well behaved night rain", lulled us into thinking we'd escaped. Instead we were drenched in dew, pollen and rain drops from giant heavily laden foliage! We stopped for coffee and cake in a hillside café to recover. Everything chest down was soaked!

## A Day to Remember

Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> June, 2022 a date to be etched on our memories. A day of celebration to honour one Lady, Her Majesty the Queen, our longest reigning Monarch.

On this day even our weather was kind, adding cheer with some warmth and sunshine to a declared national holiday, while everywhere, people gathered in gardens and parks to enjoy the company of others, make new friends or catch up with neighbours. Festooned with bunting, most of it home made by Bayford's knitters, the picnic was well attended, folks sitting at tables, on straw bales or on the grass, with complimentary teas and cakes provided while over the hubbub corks were-a-popping as toasts were drunk to 'The Queen'. Just across the road the Baker Arms added a wider selection of sustenance.

Neville Hudson made a short speech reflecting on reign. with local resident Joan Morris, the same age as Her Majesty, by his side. Keeping rhythmic note, background music was provided by a steel band. And we must not forget our newly formed community choir singing a specially written Jubilee song.



The young, and those somewhat older were present, the latter recalling the time Her Majesty became head of the 'firm', while the younger generation will be able to recall this day and relay history as it was made to their own grandchildren.

A tulip tree has been planted by the Parish Council on the green in lasting recognition of seventy years of her reign, an unprecedented achievement.

#### **Essendon Nature Notes**

If you have ever wondered how the old table-top football game, Subbuteo, found its name, look no further than one of our summer falcons, the hobby. The originator was inspired by this beautiful bird, the Latin name of which is Falco subbuteo. I was reminded of this obscure fact on a recent evening walk through the fields that border the River Lea at the bottom of Essendon Hill hobbies were making hav while the sun shone, feasting voraciously on flying insects and characteristically plucking the wings of their prey in flight before devouring Although small as a falcon, they are a striking bird with black moustache and red 'trousers'.

The hobby arrives from Africa every spring and is often a bird of reed beds and lakes, preying on damselflies and dragonflies using its remarkable speed and acrobatics to catch them on the wing. Later in the summer they will use that airborne agility to change their diet from insects to young birds including swallows and martins. They will even take bats and rob other birds to feed their own young in the old nests of crows.

Hobbies have been on the increase. Indeed prior to the 1960s the last ones to breed locally were in Hertford in 1875. In the past they were a target for egg-collectors so the decline of this practice as a 'hobby' alongside the effect of climate change may have accelerated their expansion. They are certainly a welcome addition to our summer evenings so look out for them and don't forget their Latin moniker. DC

On Friday October 21st 1977 George, Anne, Thomas and Jasper dog moved to Farmleigh, Berkhamsted Lane, Essendon, Around 12.15 p.m. on the following Sunday morning the front doorbell rang and standing there were Michael and Joy Hargreaves who had walked up from Little B. after Church to welcome us. We realised that Farmleigh was equidistant from Essendon and Little B. Churches and we joined Little B. The Hartford Hundred Group had recently been put together and Rev. Jack Davies and family had been moved from Essendon to the then Rectory in Little. B. in charge of the Group. George asked the Rector about giving an annual Covenant to the Church and was told very firmly that water was pouring through the roof at Essendon and they needed the money so we decided to follow it. The water continued to pour in and was causing considerable anxiety, and George, in a wild moment, thought something should be done, and a meeting was called in Essendon Village Hall. George set off very apprehensively wondering if anyone would turn up - there was an amazing attendance and a very good Committee was formed. He was elected as Chairman with representation from all sides of the local community who realised that St. Mary's was an important part of local life and couldn't just be left to fall down. There were all sorts of amazing money raising ideas put forward, carefully planned and thought through, but so enjoyed by many including the first Gardens' Open Day brought back from Norfolk. Eventually the money was raised. St. Mary's was 'water tight' and, much more importantly, it brought people together. The Restoration Committee was closed down and The Friends of St. Mary's formed and this is still flourishing today, for the benefit and entertainment of so many.

My own first introduction to Essendon Village life was to Penny and the then 'Meals on Wheels Service'. This, of course, no longer used for understandable food safety reasons, but it was a worthwhile connection with people in our community. There were one or two very cold winter at this time and we had our adventures!

Annual Charity Suppers which originated at Farmleigh, sitting up the stairs, the early Carol Concerts which Judy so brilliantly turned into the Christmas Suppers in the Church for all our community. Dear Canon Lovell, the names of past Rectors who followed on after Jack Davies, gentle John Andrews whose wife always said that she married an architect not a Rector. The great team of John and Margaret Cotton followed,

Margaret, herself also a superb Magistrate too and it was from her I learnt to. ask 'How are you today' - a question that always has an a answer. 'Better than yesterday' or 'not so good today' etc. but always a question that people can a reasonably answer easily. John and Margaret were followed, so happily by Pauline with Rod's support and now we have Theresa with dear Solomon. We also owe our grateful thanks to two very good friends, both in the 15 month Vacancy when we never missed a Service throughout the Hartford Group and, in recent times. A big 'Thankyou' to Ian lane an our own dear Rosemary.

This is all part of life in this lovely community surrounding us all. The five villages, that make up the Hartford Hundred Group of Churches and the longstanding friendships that have gone on over many years. These last years have not been easy, made so complicated by all the restrictions caused by Covid and the difficulties of not being able to communicate with each other but it has also brought out a wonderful spirit of thoughtfulness and kindness, not only among good friends but also among complete strangers. We must all build on this in the days ahead.

You would be reading this for ever if I thanked everyone individually. We held our breath as we watched wondering if it would light, but we need not have worried, for off it went and a huge round of applause rang out.




# Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations Vintage Jea and Cakes Concert






