Rector's Article.

Thy Kingdom of come!

The Kingdom of God is where God rules and is sovereign. It is a kingdom where He has authority, dominion and power. God does this with love through the Holy Spirit.

During Jesus's time on earth He moved around with his disciples. These disciples were keen learners. They observed Jesus with curiosity. They would observe him pray and were surprised by how effective Jesus's prayers were. We must remember that these disciples were people who had left everything to follow Jesus. They devoted their time and lives to serve people. Given that they were so dedicated it is

easy to understand that they were eager to seek the 'kingdom things'. 'Seek you first the kingdom of God and his righteousness...' Matthew 6:33.

One day, they asked Jesus in sincerity of heart to teach them to pray. Jesus answered them by teaching them the 'Lord 's prayer'. This is effectively a model of how to pray. In particular, I would like to draw your attention to the verse of the Lord's prayer which savs. 'Thy Kingdom come'. As mentioned above, the Kingdom of God is where God has influence and rules. As we say 'Thy Kingdom come' we are actually opening our hearts to God. Practically, we will be surrendering our will and ways to Him. We will be saving may your life. Iesus Christ. manifest in us. This means that He will guide all aspects of our lives: the way we live, our relationships in our community with families, friends.

By saying 'Thy Kingdom come', one will be trusting God with his or her life. For the Kingdom of God is one of righteousness, peace and joy. Yes, hard times are there but when we allow His Kingdom to come in our lives, He is full of compassion and love. God will not allow us to walk alone. He will be our standby, helper and advocate. His love extends to everyone - ves to everyone. Waiting to hear from us the words 'Thy Kingdom Come' is our Father, our Master, our Healer, Our Shepherd, Ever present and all-knowing God. 'Thy Kingdom come' means vielding to His will.

With assurance and absolute confidence that in His Kingdom our sins are forgiven.

Ukraine Update

The Hartford Hundred Group of Parishes has been especially generous in their welcome to Ukrainians who have been displaced from their country as a result of the war. A Parish Support Group was set up to investigate how we could assist families fleeing the war torn country. Several hosts came forward and soon we were working with a variety of agencies and individuals to find out more about the process of hosting.

In May 2022 our first guests arrived to live with host Sara Walduck in Bayford.

Tanya and her daughter Dasha (24) flew in from Kyiv to a very different life here. Tanya, a Clinical Psychologist, continued to work with clients online in Ukraine. At Christmas time Tanya was part of the Ukrainian choir which sang in Hertford Castle and they both sold beautiful Christmas cards they had made. In December Tanya moved to Scotland to be with her son who was studying at University there and Dasha moved to another host family in London with hopes to pursue her dream to go to Art College.

In July 2022 Alona and her son Egor arrived in Essendon to stay with hosts, Mandy and Vince Nevel. Alona's daughter Daryna (23) was also hosted for three months before she returned to Kyiv. They had driven all the way across Europe to get here and they were soon settled into the household. The first task was to get Egor (14)) into school and he was lucky to secure a place at Richard Hale on the last day of the summer holidays. Alona is a patent attorney and now works with a firm in London. In December they both moved to a rented flat in Hertford but still retain close links with their friends in our community and are grateful for the start they got here.

In November Heather and Simon Ross from Brickendon agreed to host Iryna who was an accountant in Ukraine. She learned English through the classes run by volunteers at the St Andrew's Church in Hertford. As transport over the winter was difficult there has been a rota of incredibly kind local people from our villages who drove Iryna back and forth to the classes. She also worked part time in the Farmer's Boy in Brickendon. Iryna has recently moved on to live with members of her family who live in the UK and now have space for her.


Also in November, Judy Rennie in Essendon began to host Valentyna, who is a mental health therapist, and her daugher Katerina. Valentyna enjoyed her time here but at Easter she had to return to Ukraine to nurse her elderly father. Katerina studies at the University of Hertfordshire and lives in the accommodation on the campus. She will be staying on in the UK and Valentyna is also welcome to stay with Judy when she comes back to see her daughter.

We have now welcomed a guest family to Little Berkhamsted. Quintin and Trish McKellar are now hosting (another) Valentyna and her son Oleksii. They have already been living with a host family in Cambridge for a year. Valentyna practised as a barrister in Ukraine and hopes to work in a legal environment in the UK. Oleksii will be starting school in Hertford (He already knows Egor who lived in Essendon with the Nevels).

Many people in Hartford Hundred group of churches have come forward to help our guests in lots of different ways- too many to mention here but please know you are really appreciated. It has been wonderful to see our community coming together to help others not as fortunate as ourselves. We will continue to support those still with us- and any more who seek to come. 

Obituary – By the death of Mrs. Saunders, at the age of 87, Essendon has lost its oldest inhabitant and many will miss the tall, upright, picturesque figure in a sun bonnet, walking briskly along the village street or tending her pretty cottage garden.

She was of Scottish birth and bringing up and though the last 20 years of her life were spent in this quiet parish, she had gone through experiences which are probably unique, having actually lived on the scenes and shared in the horrors of four great wars – the Indian Mutiny, the Crimean, the American civil war and the Franco-Prussian war.

During the American war she was nurse to Mrs. Jefferson Davis, the wife of the leader of the Confederate States and could show the scars on her hands of wounds received in saving a child of theirs from being captured by a soldier whom she caught by the throat and rendered helpless.

A woman naturally of great strength and endurance, she retained her vigour of mind and body to a wonderful degree and though she began to fail last winter, just after reaching her 87th birthday, she only took to her bed a few weeks before she died.

Gardening

Sitting here on what is at last a lovely sunny day, my eye was suddenly caught by an old gardening magazine lying about with the headline 'We love July' so I hope by the time you read this it is still true!

Feed and mulch Rhubarb now that most harvesting is over. Sow salad leaves where early potatoes have been harvested and do your watering as early as you can so your plants don't get too dry. If you are a herb grower the following seem the most useful – Basil, Chives, Oregano, Rosemary, Sage and Thyme - on the whole these are great sun-lovers and like good drainage so find an ideal spot for them.

If you have Summer house plants don't overwater them and potting mixes that are too wet for very long are a killer, so let them reach a slight 'drought' so the oxygen gets in and the roots breath before you re-water properly and add a balanced house plant feed every fourth watering or so.

Cut back Wisterias taking long whippy stems back to about 7 buds with a harder pruning to follow in January or February. Bay trees can also be pruned now and Philadelphus straight after flowering but don't touch your autumn-fruiting Raspberries. Continue to 'dead-head' Roses, keep on removing side shoots on your tomatoes and, if in the greenhouse, it is worth keeping the areas around them moist.

Climbing French beans and Runner beans will soon be reaching the top of their supports so use sharp scissors to cut out the tips which will encourage more side shots and an even bigger yield!

Regularly remove faded flowers from roses, dahlias and sweet peas and you can avoid 'dead heading' by bringing some of these blooms into the house.

Enjoy your gardens and all your plants!







Ronald Blythe'


Ronald Blythe, the author of Akenfield, lived at the end of an overgrown farm track deep in the rolling countryside of the Stour Valley, on the border between Suffolk and Essex. His home was Bottengoms Farm, a sturdy yeoman's house once owned by the artist John Nash. From here, Blythe spent almost half a century observing the slow turn of the agricultural year, the church year and village life in a series of rich, lyrical rural diaries.

Next to nature is in the form of a diary. But it is clearly the product of many years of daily observation.

It is the kind of book that you don't want to finish but you can't put down.

Sometimes, it is difficult to know whether he is imagining the time of Constable, whose relatives owned several farms nearby, or he is recounting his own experiences.

I cannot recommend it more highly.
