ear All The Coronation of King Charles III was a momentous occasion celebrated across the kingdom, but nowhere was it more eagerly anticipated than in the five local villages. Residents had been preparing for months, eagerly looking forward to the three-day event which was set to be a highlight of the year. The excitement was palpable as the day finally arrived, and most people in the five villages gathered together to celebrate the crowning of our new king.

To celebrate the Coronation, Hartford Hundred West Group held a Family Group Service, which saw the local community choir coming together to sing hvmns and celebrate the occasion. Many people came to pay their respects to the new king, and the atmosphere was one of joyous celebration as the choir sang out in unison. As the service came to a close, refreshments and time of fellowship followed. "I enjoyed the service, the choir lifted our spirits high" said one of the community members who had just attended. "People paid attention to the sermon and the prayers for the King were said in style" added another one. There were plenty of smiles and chatter as people reminisced the aspects of the service. Surely, it was a revival in the life of the Church and the Community. Afterwards, the crowds spilled out to their community events. eager to continue the celebrations. Some of the celebrations had started as early as Friday. The crown competition/displays and the live concert held at Little

Berkhamsted Church brought many people into the Church.

Over the whole weekend, the villages came alive with a series of parties and events that brought most people together. Village parties were held on the fields, with tables laden with food and drinks for everyone to enjoy. People chatted and laughed as they caught up with old friends, while children ran around playing games and making new friends.

The food was delicious, with local delicacies prepared specially for the occasion. There were platters of fresh seafood. succulent meats. and colourful salads, along with plenty of bread, cheese, and fruits. In some drinks villages. flowed freelv. providing refreshment for the crowds. Some even brought their own homemade cakes etc to share with their neighbours.

The weather held up on Sunday, with bright sunshine and warm temperatures adding to the festive atmosphere. People lounged on picnic blankets, soaked up the sun and enjoyed the music and entertainment on offer. There were live bands playing folk music. Children could be seen running around with painted faces, playing games and having fun.

Many expressed their gratitude for the opportunity to come together as a community and celebrate a shared moment of history.

There was a sense of satisfaction and contentment in the air, as people reflected on the memories, they had made over the coronation. For many, the coronation of King Charles III



### ESSENDON NEWS - September 1902 Coronation festivities (King Edward VII):

Our Coronation festivities, which had been postponed from June 26th due to the King's illness, were successfully enjoyed on August 8th. The original programme was to be carried out with the exception of the bonfire which we had on June 30th. The weather was not all that could be desired, but we consoled ourselves with the thought that during this summer, it has often been worse. There was some keen competition in the sports which were held in Bedwell Park. Nearly 200 children had tea in the reading room and about 300 adults sat down to a substantial repast in the schoolroom. A really excellent display of fireworks kindly given by Mr. Phillip Coldham on the evening of the Coronation day in the cricket field was much enjoyed by a large crowd, which dispersed about 10pm. after joining heartily in "God save the King". It has been decided to hand over the balance of the Coronation fund about £6.00 to Parish Nurse Fund.



## Gardening

After not an easy time for gardeners in the early months of this year and there is still so much that needs doing but Nature has a wonderful way of gradually getting things back to normal!

If you are tidying up around Hellebores, carefully save and pot up seedlings, they may not flower in the future exactly like their 'parents' so can be a lovely surprise!

If you have climbing or rambler roses that seem to be getting out of hand, tie in stems as horizontally as possible so that they send out more side shoots so more flowers. Don't forget to keep 'earthing up' your early potatoes. Begin regular feeding of potted plants using a high potassium feed but don't overfeed them!

Keep a good eye on your frames and greenhouses with your fruiting plants. Tomatoes, peppers, aubergines etc. need regular watering to help them to fruit well and give them a weekly high potassium feed. Check the greenhouse thermometer in hot spells, using shading and ventilation to keep temperatures down.

Plant out your Dahlias in a warm sunny spot with good soil and where you can see and enjoy them and make sure you have good stakes ready for them! The famous 'Chelsea Chop' is around now, cutting off fading flowers to encourage more and continue to collect up the bits.

Above all, enjoy all you are doing, exchange plants with friends and neighbours and it is surprising how different gardens, often close together, vary in what grows best!

Find a quiet commenced and after much hissing spot, keep watch and see which new and commotion eventually the owl neighbour gives the game away. drove the crow off, the two birds silhouetted against the darkening sky DC with the owl in pursuit. The same scene was played out the following evening but this time it was the owl which decided that discretion was the better part of valour. Nonetheless the crow must have decided to look for a more secluded residence and there was no nest this year.

The best way to find nests, if you want to avoid the old schoolboy's trick of using a stout stick to flush the sitting birds, is to stay stock-still. Before long you notice the same bird heading back and forth, perhaps with nesting material, perhaps to feed the young. Last year I was surprised to a see a pair of great tits disappearing underground through a hole in the bottom of the old pear tree but they raised a brood successfully from this unlikely site.

This year for the first time the openfronted nest box at the back of the clematis was used, taken by a pair of robins and they laid five eggs. Sadly a couple of weeks later the eggs had been taken, showing what a precarious business this is. However, in the field opposite the jackdaws have found a safe hole in the branch of an oak. I have been keeping an eve on their noisy
