Dear All We are approaching the season of Lent. The period of Lent is from the 2nd March to 14th April. This season occurs prior to the important Christian festival of Easter. Although we often associate Lent with the time leading up to Jesus dying on the cross, Lent is also remembered for the 40 days of fasting and prayer Jesus

undertook in the wilderness prior to starting his ministry. Matthew 4:1-11 outlines the story of Jesus being led by the Holy Spirit to enter into the wilderness in order to be tempted by the devil whilst fasting. As Jesus gave up food,

people during the time of Lent often commemorate the period of Lent by abstaining from some pleasure in life. This may be anything from chocolates, to dairy, to social media. The isolated time away from a pleasure often leads to people feeling themselves draw closer to God. Since, as their mind wanders to the thing they are doing without instead of partaking in it at that moment, they are reminded of the discipline Jesus underwent to help him fulfil his ministry and mission. In this way, it helps us reflect on the love Christ had for us, that he was willing to dedicate his life for our sakes. Yet, it can also cause the question of, "what is my mission here on earth and what things do I need to align myself to fulfil it?" to rise within us.

Prior to his ministry, one could say his purpose was a carpenter. Making and providing products that would benefit the livelihood of people was his main focus until he was about 30 years of age. After this his focus changed to ministering

to people and revealing God's goodness in their lives. Then in the later part of his earthly life, his purpose shifted to dying for our salvation and giving us hope through What his resurrection. he did externally shifted and changed according to the season of life he was in, but throughout it all he had purpose and was a son in whom God was well pleased.

In the same way, our life circumstances can shift and change depending on the season we are in. Maybe you are a mother whose purpose in this time is to love your children in the best way you know how, which brings God glory. Or maybe you have a job where you bring your talents to produce the best quality of service or product for the benefit of your clients, with which you bring God glory. Or maybe this is a season in your life where you are unsure of your purpose. With it all we can know that firstly God is with us. Secondly, if we are finding it difficult to decipher what the purpose of God is for our lives in this season, then we can follow the example of Jesus throughout the time of Lent. As we consider abstaining from a pleasure or multiple pleasures, may it create room for our hearts and ears to be turned more fully to God to hear his plans and purposes for us in our season.



Essendon Nature Notes

Just four or five miles up the road is one of my favourite rambles through Bramfield woods with its mixture of deciduous trees and Corsican pine. These woods are deeply atmospheric and evocative and when the mist is cloaking the paths and rills with its sullen dampness it seems to justify the epithet of 'forest'. If you do take a walk there make sure you take the bridleway to Tewin to pass the exceptional 16th century Queen Hoo Hall which is tucked away on the fringe of these ancient woods with views over the valley to the south and adds to the sense of a place that has changed little over the centuries.

The village itself is a little off the beaten track but the thatched cottages and the church, which was reputed to be Thomas à Becket's first living, make it worth a detour. On a recent morning visit, I witnessed the additional attraction of a party of hawfinches settled in the yew trees at the back of the churchyard. A shy and reserved bird these are rarely seen and have been in decline. Seeing one is a red-letter day as there are now thought to be less than a thousand pairs in the UK albeit Hertfordshire has been a stronghold over the years. It is our largest finch but what really marks it out is its massive beak which allows it to perform its party trick of cracking the seeds of the wild cherry giving it its various country names such as 'cherry finch' and 'berry breaker'. It likes other large seeds particularly hornbeam, beech and maple as well as hips and haws from the hedgerow.

If you get to see one it really is a quite striking and impressive bird particularly the male with its smart chestnut plumage and black on the wings and throat. They seem to have quite a liking for Bramfield but given that Essendon is not dissimilar in being surrounded by woodlands punctuated with hornbeam, I am hopeful that we might see one or two of these in our own churchvard at some point. It might mean a few less cherries but I think it would be worth the sacrifice.



Gardening in March

Sitting here writing this in the first week in February, it is really very mild and certainly very windy and I wonder what March has brought in. The snowdrops, aconites, early iris and hellebores have been a delight and the latter continue to be so but there was quite a lot to clear and tie up among the shrubs after those strong winds and check again that things are secure. That mild weather and soil warming up also meant that the slug population started to make its presence felt so that the early new shoots on plants coming through had a tough time. If weather permits, and it has rained, you can go on a very successful 'snail and slug-foray' in the early evening and collect them up very easily before they start laving their eggs!

Divide your favourite herbaceous perennials which have formed big clumps, keeping just the best bits with good roots.

Make sure you have empty compost bins ready for the coming season and, on a dry day, hoe early weeds emerging. Hoe carefully so you get the weeds out and a little hand fork helps. Prune your dogwoods/ cornus to keep their shape after their glorious winter display so they will be ready for next year. Move herbs you have been sheltering indoors to a protected place outside and water your outside pots if the weather is very dry. Germander Speedwell



Managing St Andrew's Churchyard for Wildlife

At a recent meeting, the Parochial Church Council for St Andrew's church in Little Berkhamsted, decided that over the coming year they would concentrate improving on the churchvard so that it both looked better for the people of the village and became a haven for wildlife. To this end, you may have already seen the smart new picket fence which has been installed on the side of Robins Nest Hill, and work has already started on refurbishing the post and rail fence in the churchyard along its boundary with Church Road.

Today churchyards have an important role to play in contributing to the patchwork of sites in an area which provide a refuge for the various species whose habitats are being eroded by new buildings and also some current methods of farming and gardening. The first phase will be to carry out a survey of the churchyard to identify what wildlife species are currently inhabiting the area before developing a management plan for the churchyard to incorporate some specific patches which will be managed to encourage and promote the wildlife. As with virtually every churchyard in the country, ours has a large area of grassland which can be an important habitat. Many meadows which were rich in wild flowers, butterflies and other insects have been lost since the 1940s, and churchvards are often the last refuge for the species they support.

Expert help is available within the Diocese to carry out the survey work

Andrew's life and to set up the maintenance plan, but we are hoping to hear from anybody in Little Berkhamsted who would be willing to become involved in creating a churchyard for wildlife. If you are interested in helping with this project, please contact either Sandie Ash (The Churchwarden) or me - Ian Bailey (PCC Secretary) - whose details are listed in the front cover of the magazine.


