Rector's Article.

Dear All.

The time of Lent and Easter is a time of reflection. Flashing back on Jesus's journey to the cross for us to be set free, it was a total sacrifice, agape love or unconditional love. As He was heading to the cross, I am amazed at the special mention of the women, who had accompanied Him all the way from Galilee to Jerusalem: Salome, Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James and Joses. With a unique lustre the dedication of these women stands out. They secretly remained with Christ at the toughest moment.

Another disciple who stood out on this crucial journey was- Joseph of Arimathea, who boldly went to Pilate and requested permission to bury the Lord after Jesus's Christ had given up His spirit on the cross. I can image the surprise to Pilate and the provocation to the other lews, that a member of the Sanhedrin could decisively stand up for the Crucified Iesus. We us be assured -we are never alone. The act separated Joseph forever from the institution that killed the Lord. In spiritual sense, Joseph buried himself religiously, socially and economically. After the embalmment of Jesus's body Iesus was placed in Joseph's new tomb. Iesus did not accumulate wealth during His reign on earth but whenever He needed anything it was available. This is mind blowing!

Fast forward, before dawn on Sunday morning, the two Marys came to see the tomb (Matt:28:1-10. As they arrived, there was a great earthquake, in normal circumstances, an earthquake causes devastating results including death but this one was a unique earthquake. An angel

descended from heaven, rolled back the stone from the mouth of the tomb and sat on it. Waah! We serve a living God who has everything under His feet. The Roman guards, frightened, and astonished by this radiant being clothed majestically-fainted.

During His time on earth Jesus would eat with tax collectors, argue with the Pharisees but from the time of His crucifixion to ascension the focus and attention was on those who believed in Him. Taking no notice of the frozen guards, the angel reassured the women that there is nothing to fear, the one they were seeking for was risen. The stone was rolled away for the women to believe that He had risen. The Lord was alive and was to meet them in Galilee. The angel told the women to go quickly and announce the news to His disciples.

In Galilee, the risen Christ met His disciples on a mountain. What a great union. His sufferings were now past. In His glorious body He stood before them. They worshipped the loving and living God – some doubted but Christianity is a journey of trust and faith. The risen Christ told them that all authority had been given to Him in heaven and on earth. He gave them a commission with three commands not suggestions –" Go therefore and make disciples of all nations". Let us not loss hope – He is alive.

Essendon Vestry Minute Book, 1833 - 1917.

Herts Archives have entered our 'Zeppelin book' for Hertfordshire Museum Object of the Year.

Hertfordshire Archives holds many parish records but only one believed to have been damaged by enemy action. This vestry minute book (DP/37/8/16) was damaged during the airship raid on Essendon in September 1916, in which Captain William Leefe Robinson won the Victoria Cross for shooting down an airship. The damage, believed to be from shrapnel, includes holes piercing the front cover and evidence of scorching. You can see the vestry minute book on display at Hertfordshire Archives and Local Studies library. 

Roadmap to re-opening the Baker Arms

With the pub now listed as an Asset of Community Value (ACV) we have informed AHDC that we intend to make a bid for the pub. We have obtained a professional commercial valuation and written to McM to get their response.. This may trigger a further meeting with Tom McMullen. We are starting the process to set up a Community Benefit Society and Community Interest Company which will allow us to receive funding from the government scheme.

application has been lodged with the Plunkett Foundation, a charity that offers help and professional advice to groups in rural areas seeking to acquire and run community-owned businesses. FOBA have had a number of Zoom meetings with our Plunkett consultant, Mark Golding, which were extremely useful. We're also hearing from other community pub groups, like the Red Lion in Aston who have recently opened under community ownership. Some great people have offered to help - we'd love to hear from anyone else who has expertise in community engagement, the planning development system. construction, fundraising and food and drink.

The Right of Wav Issue.

In September (a few months after the closure of the pub), large planters were placed across the entry/exit to the car park to prevent vehicle access. Although a gap was left so walkers could still pass through, large signs were fixed to the planters stating 'No Public Right of Way'. The route via the car park provides the only safe way between Ashendene Road and Brickendon Lane because it avoids the very dangerous bend in the road where there is no footpath. Therefore, it has always been much used by walkers, especially those going to the station, and also horse riders.

The 'blocking' of this route was

discussed at a Parish Council meeting and, as the future of the pub and its land are uncertain and the signs use the legal wording to challenge the public's right to use the route, it was agreed that an application should be made to Hertfordshire County Council to record the route as a public right of way.

To claim a right of way through public use you need to provide evidence that it has been used openly (without force, secrecy or permission) for the last 20 years. We will be circulating 'User Evidence Forms' to Bayford residents to collect this information but if you live outside the village and have used this route regularly between 2003-2023 we would be interested to hear from you. contact Andrea Trendler on 01992 511588

GARDENING in MARCH

The unusual weather patterns we seem to have had over recent months make planning ahead very far from easy but our gardens are very resilient and may this March bring a bit of normality once again! It has been a delight once more seeing the snowdrops, crocuses and other early Spring bulbs followed by the amazing hellebores and it is also a joy watching the buds develop on the early shrubs.

If you are planning new borders, March is the time to do this before new growth becomes too fast. All Gardeners will be praying that the soil will be beginning to gradually warm up so, if you are planning a new border and conditions are fit, start by clearing and preparing the soil, working it over well by using any spare composted material for nature to work on.

Hopefully there will be warmer days this month when herbaceous plants can be divided and, if handled carefully, re-planted, watered in well and the weather is reasonable, they should soon 'take off'.

There is still time to sow tomato seed indoors, so choose favourites, even trying a new variety. Key flowers to consider for the Spring are Cowslips, Primroses, Hellebores, Snake's head fritillaries and Crown Imperials – spoil yourselves should you be able to purchase any of these!

Other things to be done! Cut back hardy Fuchsias to control the size of the shrub and take your Dahlias out of their 'winter storage' checking that there are no rotten or shrivelled tubers – pot them up then they can grow with some protection before finally putting them in place once frosts are over. Give them a good soak when they go into the cold frames or greenhouse and protect them from late frosts.

Essendon Nature Notes

Surprisingly a pheasant has suddenly nesting species. started appearing regularly in the garden in recent weeks. It gives the dogs something to chase but despite its and ungainliness it size always manages to escape. There something slightly comical about it as scuttles head away, pointing upwards like a stout man running for a bus. We are allowed to talk about this bird without much reverence given its status as an introduced game bird, its numbers boosted each vear by the release of large numbers bred in captivity. Nonetheless this native of Asia has been here so long, probably the Romans. that it established itself as a mainstay of our image of the English countryside. Whilst game managed woodland is usually beneficial for wildlife, as an introduced species the pheasant's impact is not necessarily all positive the increase in predator and populations such as foxes can have a detrimental impact on other ground-

On closer inspection the male really is magnificent with its chestnut body and iridescent green head. Despite the flambovance of their coloration, it provides surprisingly good camouflage and you can often find yourself alongside them before they finally get flushed and startle you, flying off with a characteristic and guttural "cok-cokcok" and a noisy flapping of wings. The hen is less showy and more restrained. its brown and black mottled plumage an understated counterpoint to the male's flashy exuberance.

The entrance to the Village Hall has a faded print of one on the wall, perhaps analogous to this overlooked species itself. However, it is March and the pheasant is now safe until October, at least from the guns, giving us a chance to take a new look at this old bird.





THE ESSENDON STORM of 1846

On Saturday last a very severe storm burst over the town of Hertford and neighbourhood. The storm commenced about six o'clock in the evening, and lasted with more or less fury for some hours. The lightning was very vivid, and the peals of thunder resembled continued discharges of artillery. In Hertford, the rain poured down like a rapid torrent, as though a river were emptying itself through large outlets.

At Essendon considerable damage was done. The storm raged with great fury, and was accompanied by hail, similar to that which fell in the metropolis. Some of the hail stones, which were picked after the storm, measured three inches in circumference. The damage done to the gardens and green houses of C. J. Dimsdale, Esq., of Essendon-place, was very extensive. Besides a large quantity of fruit being bruised, and vegetables cut to pieces by the terrific showers of hail, no less than 3000 panes of glass were broken. Many of the windows of the dwelling-house were also destroyed.

The houses the village and the old church also shared in the devastation occasioned by the "pitiless storm." After the showers were over, a great number of birds were found dead. Camfield-place, the seat of Baron Dimsdale; and Bedwell, the seat of Sir Culling Eardley Smith, have also suffered injury, scarcely less extent than that described to have occurred at Essendon-place.

At Bedwell Park farm, where a boy in the service of Mr. Rayment was in charge of a horse and cart, the horse, affrighted by the vivid lightning, started off, throwing down the boy, who received such severe injuries from the cart passing over him, that he died a few hours afterwards.




