Dear All The Hartford Hundred Group Confirmation Service

The 13th of March 2022 was a great day in the Hartford Hundred Group of Parishes. Some people from all the five villages descended on Bayford Church. It was a confirmation service that happened in our group for the first time after many years. Not only did people from the Hartford Hundred Group come together but also relatives and friends of the candidates from near and far a field came to witness this special occasion.

Different groups had worked together to ensure that the service would run smoothly. These included: the confirmation candidates, the choir led by Paul the organist, Churchwardens, providers of refreshments etc.

Prior to the service the group choir consisting of members from some of our Churches had rehearsed for this service. They also came together well before the service to practise for the occasion. While practising they were graced by the arrival of the Right Revd Michael Beasley Bishop of Hertford

The procession then commenced from the back of the Church with the choir all robed up in their beautiful gowns in front, then the Rector, followed by the Churchwardens holding their staffs of authority, the Bishop and then Heather Ross the Ordinand who acted as the Bishop's chaplain that on dav. Everything managed to establish a lovely sense of welcome, order, unity and involvement. God's presence was among us.

At the start of the service a warm

welcome on behalf of the community was done by the Churchwardens. The main focus was on the six candidates for confirmation. They sat at the front of the Church with eyes full of expectation, iov and а bit of anxiousness. It must be mentioned that they were all immaculately dressed. The six varied in age from 13 years to mid-fifties.

The Bishop led the Service. A clear explanation of what confirmation is was given at the start. This included giving the history of this ceremony. Most people were reminded of their baptism vows at this service. The confirmation concluded with the Holy Communion. The newly confirmed candidates were the first people to receive communion followed by others. Many children and adults also came for a blessing.

After the service there was further fellowship amongst the people who had attended. People also had a chance to speak to the Bishop and some prayers were said for others. There were also photo opportunities for firstly: the candidates with the Bishop and then other congregation members who wished to have a photo taken. It indeed became a joyous occasion for all who attended.

One of the congregation member commented afterwards "This is the best service I have attended for years, another one said, "We were all happy". To God be all the glory. One of the Confirmed candidates, Paula, wrote" It's a journey that will never end and it's completely unique to me. I learn something new everyday and I look forward to seeing where God will lead me next". We continue to offer faithful prayers for those confirmed and all His Church.





Essendon Nature Notes

The hawthorn hedge I planted the January before last will be in blossom this month. Each plant has been transformed from tiny 'whips' into head height fledgling bushes and it is easy to see why it is called quickthorn. Hopefully it won't be long before the hedge is dense enough to be full of nests for our native birds and summer migrants. Unlike the blackthorn, the hawthorn blossom appears after the leaves and it is one of the magnificent sights of May, its clouds of white flowers lining the hedgerows like late spring snow. The haws can be used to make jelly or wine come the autumn but even in spring the flower buds and leaves can be eaten and are called "bread and cheese" in Wales.

The hawthorn has deep roots in our landscape and is steeped in mythology and folklore. Indeed the Glastonbury thorn, the twiceflowering version that grows in Somerset, is supposed to have sprung from a staff thrust into the ground by Joseph of Arimathea. According to Gaelic legend, the hawthorn is believed to be the home of the fairies and marks the entrance to the otherworld. It is bad luck to cut down a 'Fairy Thorn'. So, if you see one in the middle of a farmer's field, he or she is likely to be a superstitious sort.

In Celtic folklore, the hawthorn is said to heal a broken heart and recent research has shown that the berries and flowers do indeed have a medicinal impact on cardiac troubles. So this spring if you are crying over a lost love, pick a few leaves and make some hawthorn tea. You might help yourself find a new amour by washing your face on Mayday with the dew from blossoms, as it is supposed to bestow youth and beauty...but watch out for those thorns. DC



Gardening in May

Taking over a new garden is exciting! I have nothing like as much to look after and have inherited the most beautiful deep red Camelia. The garden is going to be a complete change, very much smaller and a lovely terrace area both for a table and chairs and big pots right outside at the back. The bulbs have been amazing and it now looks tidy but my new lawn needs some work! The perennial Salvias in their big pots have been cleaned out, the plants re-shaped taking out any dead wood and they look fine. I brought my Dahlia corms with me but labels have vanished in the move so height and colour could be interesting this Summer!

Shop for the summer seasonal plants that are attractive to pollinators such as Antirrhinum, Calendula, single poppies and Nicotiana.


Prune Spring-flowering shrubs, cutting back the flowering stems of Forsythia and Flowering Currant to lower stems to keep their shape. You can also carefully move self-seeded annuals from last year to new positions and sow Sunflowers directly into the ground.

As the weather gets warmer house plants that need a humid atmosphere will benefit from being grouped together to make 'misting' simpler. Continue successional sowing of carrots, beetroot, spinach and other salad crops and parsley and coriander can be sown directly into the ground by the end of May. Sow climbing, runner and French beans under cover ready to plant out, keep 'hand-weeding' round your young plants such as garlic, onions and leeks and 'earth up' your early potatoes as they show through. If you have a pond, remove duckweed and blanketweed but leave it to dry out to give aquatic life time to get back into the pond!

Keep an eye on your roses for blackspot, mildew and rust which are difficult to control without using fungicides but it greatly helps if you remove and destroy any leaves showing signs of any of this.


