Blessed be God for ever.



# Memories of the war

It's been more than a year since I had to leave my country.

My homeland, my loved ones, my plans, my understandable prospects, my comfort zone, and my certainty have remained thousands of kilometres behind the back of our winter jackets and suitcase wheels

Despite the level of danger, the decision to leave everything behind was difficult. I think most people are familiar with the scene from the "Titanic" film where the captain of the ship decides to go down with it, because he knew that the tragedy that had happened was largely his responsibility. Therefore, he considered it worthy to perish on his own board rather than to try to save himself, leaving the deck entrusted him. With the proviso that we can't fact check it anyway.

That was the hardest dilemma that kept us in the grip of doubt for a month, in our house's basement. Which we were lucky enough to have compared to many others who needed to lay down in the subway stations.

Whether to jump into the bottomless abyss of the unknown, with a chance of survival, or to remain on solid ground, but ready to be buried alive in the walls of our own house. To indulge in sick-founded hopes for good fortune or to rationally cut down the roots that bound us to the homeland.

And harder than this decision was only a paralysing terror that any word, look, touch, in an attempt to keep yourself warm on the dusty concrete basement floor - would be the last memory of the people around you.

You are not afraid to perish under the rubble of your supposedly fortress or personally sentenced by unpunished looters. You are afraid to survive when they won't. Afraid of the helplessness and weakness that a frail human carcass represents. Defenceless against mechanical weapons created only for the purpose of extermination.

Or the trivial inequality of power in the dastardly physical carnage. Where the value of your life costs equally to your German washing machine.

So there was nothing more to fear after crossing borders, running from shelter to shelter, on the way to Britain, which gave hope to the battered refugees who had lost everything, including a manually amputated part of themselves, to save the rest of their exhausted bodies. The blind uncertainty of tomorrow, the difficulties of bureaucracy, the language barrier, and the depersonalisation of status and identity were only collateral damage of the massive catastrophe. Small in comparison to the loss of contact with those who have not found the opportunity, the strength or the will to leave the expanse of their homeland. They stayed to fight for their ideals face to face. Knowing the doom of that decision. To live for what you believe and to die for it.

And having kept yourself alive, at least physically, you have no right to question

their decision, no matter how much you want to get everyone out of the deathly pit.

But I know that this is not the end of our fight. Having witnessed all the motion of the human spirit and the steely stamina, the unbreakable willpower, the selfless courage of those who fled, and those who stayed, I believe that nothing can break us.

One day, our fields will be filled with the spring wheat and flowers again, covering the burnt bomb-damaged lands and giving peace to the fallen ones.

Whilst we wait for the future return of with the glossy black crown which the nightingale to our woods and gives it its name and it is easy to scrub, we can listen to the blackcap, recognise. The female is perhaps even known as the 'mock' nightingale. It is finer with its striking chestnut cap but perhaps unfair to suggest that it is it is much harder to spot, as it is somehow second rate as its song has usually the singing male which draws its own brilliance, the fluty notes the eye. We would do well to find its pouring out deep and sweet from this nest which is usually deep in the effervescent songster. occasion I hear the blackcap song each rising and it sometimes has a second spring, often from the top branches of brood to boost numbers even further. the old apple tree, always lifts the spirits. Its melodic warble bubbles and bounces along at a breathless pace and it is perhaps the finest of the warblers we are likely to hear locally. Maybe the fact that it is a summer migrant stops us from taking its vocal artistry for granted as we seem to do with the blackbirds and thrushes. A few birds do winter here, mostly from Germany, but not in sufficient numbers to stop us looking forward to the first spring arrivals from southern Europe and north Africa with anticipation.

Earlier in the season some of the summer migrants might still be on their way and later on others will have stopped singing, as they get on with the business of rearing young, so this is the time to stop and soak up the sound as the days lengthen. The Chapel of the Holy Cross and St. Alban

On Sunday 21st May at the 11.00am Family Service we will be celebrating the 90th anniversary of the Consecration of the Chapel.

What an amazing gift to this village and I thought it worthy of a short history of how it came about.

In 1883, parts of the Brickendonbury Estate were sold to the local business man, Mr. Henry Wilson

Demain Saunders. He died at an early age in 1888 and his widow, Minnie, remarried Mr. Arthur Henry Kingsley in 1892.

The Chapel was built with funds provided by Mrs. Kingsley during her lifetime. and by her daughter Constance Demain Saunders, who was responsible for its completion. The Demain Saunders family were so impressed with the way in which some friends of theirs had converted an old timbered barn into a Chapel, that they decided to ask the architect W.F. Haslip, to design a similar Chapel in Brickendon. The timber was cut from trees on the Brickendon estate and lay weathering on the Green for the necessary length of time. Constance Demain Saunders stipulated that for the building of the Chapel, men of Brickendon should be employed by the Builders, Rattee and Kett of Cambridge.

Before the building began, the field was marked in 1931 by the setting up of a Great Cross of oak, designed by Alexander Nairne, a Canon of Windsor and a close friend of the



Demain Saunders family.

On 17th May 1933 the Right Reverend Bishop Lander consecrated the Chapel and Burial Ground. The pews came from Ely Cathedral but most of the contents of the Chapel were given by the Demain Saunders family and their friends. As lovingly as the Chapel was planned and built, so was the Church Field planted.

In thanksgiving to Constance Demain Saunders and her mother, an inscription in Welsh slate by Quin Hollick was placed in the porch on Whit Sunday 22nd May, 1983. By a strange coincidence, May 22nd was the day on which Constance Demain Saunders died.

Please visit the Chapel and see for yourselves what a beautiful and peaceful place it is.





#### ESSENDON WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

Essendon WI was entertained in March by Gary Matthews, a volunteer at The Gardens of Easton Lodge, Great Dunmow. He gave a fascinating insight into the historic Warwick House and Gardens, particularly the period since 1865, when Frances Evelyn Maynard, known at Daisy, inherited the estate. She became Countess of Warwick and was mistress of the Prince of Wales, later King Edward VII.

In 1902 the Countess commissioned landscape garden designer, Harold Peto, to create stunning formal gardens and lawns, with a yew walk, wooden pergolas, a Japanese garden, an Italian garden with a balustraded lily pond and a "pleached" lime avenue with treehouse.

In 1939 Easton Lodge was requisitioned by the Army and Home Guard and during 1942/43 thousands of trees in the estate were felled to accommodate an airfield. In 1943 "Crusaders", the USAAF bomber group, took up residence. When they moved to France on D Day, the 190 and 620 Squadrons of the RAF were billeted throughout the estate.

Abandoned in 1950 after demolition of most of the house, the Gardens were forgotten for nearly 45 years. Today, the garden restoration is being undertaken by dedicated volunteers of The Gardens of Easton Lodge Preservation Trust, a charity that helps maintain, restore and renovate the Gardens allowing public access.

# THE ESSENDON VESTRY MEETINGS MINUTE BOOK, 1833

A bomb damaged book found in the Essendon St Mary's Clergy Vestry at the back of a cupboard recently, turned out to be carrying details of all the vestry meetings, from 1833 – to 1918. It has significant shrapnel damage from the 1916 Zeppelin attack.

The Vestry, which ran village matters prior to Parish Councils, was formed from parish ratepayers including the owner of Bedwell Park and other landowners and chaired by the Rector of St Mary's church. The meetings were held in the Church Vestry until 1894 when Parish Councils were formed.

The meetings are described as dealing with all spiritual and physical welfare of the Parish and its amenities and other secular matters including collecting local taxes, care of the poor, upkeep of roads, law enforcement, maintenance of church buildings and appointing parish officials.

The minute book mentions existing villagers family surnames. CR

# **Gardening**

Don't give wonderful in to temptations at Garden Centres too early in the month until you are sure that you have suitable protection from frost in your greenhouses or cold frames as there could well be still some nastv drops in overnight temperatures. When potting up your baskets, pots and troughs don't plant the plants too close together as they will get bigger and you must be able to water and feed them properly.

Once the risk of frost is over, usually round the end of May, you can plant out your 'garden ready' vegetable plants into good well-worked soil but keep one or two cloches or some fleece handy if there is a very cold night threatened. Keep an eye open for greenfly and blackfly and carefully deal with them without damaging your young plants. Should you have a Clematis Montana in you garden now is the time to prune it after its flowering - where you have room you can let it scramble just giving it a light 'tidy' but you can also really cut it back as it will quickly re-grow. Pinch out broad beans, and, on a warm morning, hoe up seedling weeds and let them wilt well before collecting them up and carefully dig out perennial weeds

- the secret is to hoe a little and often! If you have room, try and find room for another water butt so you always have plenty of water available at the right temperature. Lift and divide pond plants, repotting where necessary.

Keep earthing up your early potatoes and plant your main crop.

Lift and divide clumps of Primroses once they have finished flowering and have died back, carefully pulling the bunches apart and re-plant them somewhere in semi-shade. If you have set up your Dahlias in a place free from frost, keep an eye on them and they will want to be eventually in a sunny position – they are hungry feeders so need plenty of organic material for their final place and will need well prepared soil. Look out for slugs and snails on their new shoots and they must be kept damp. They are always well worth the effort!

## Managing St Andrew's Churchyard for Wildlife

Further to our previous article about the churchyard becoming a haven for wildlife, we had a visit from a volunteer with the Diocese who gives advice to parishes concerning how to improve their churchyard to make them more attractive to wildlife. We have now implemented two of the suggestions and will be looking closely at some of the other ideas with a view to introducing them into the churchyard either later this year or at the beginning of next.

The first suggestion which we have acted upon is the thought that we should leave an area of grass unmown from the end of May until about the end of August to encourage the growth of wild flowers and thus provide a habitat for more insects. An which is species-rich identified at the west side of the church, and you will notice that this area will not be cut with the rest of the churchyard during the above mentioned period. It will then be cut and removed in order to prevent the cuttings increasing the fertility of the soil and thus smothering the plants When you enter the underneath. churchvard from Church Road through the lychgate, you will notice on your left this area of grass which has not been cut.

Our hope is that any increase in insect population in the churchyard will also increase the bird activity within the same area, and, secondly, we have tried to encourage the birds a little bit further. Thus, we have also put up three nesting boxes which can be seen in the trees to the south of the church over towards the glebe land. The

three boxes are designed to attract blue tits, great tits and robins respectively, but we will be interested in seeing which species are attracted to nest in these boxes. Thus, if you sit on one of the benches to the south of the church, you should see at least one of the new nesting boxes in the trees towards the glebe land. If we are fortunate enough to have residents in these boxes, please keep your distance as we do not want to then scare the birds away again.

Only time will tell if these initiatives have been successful in providing an extended habitat for wildlife in our churchyard, but we will keep you posted on any progress.


