ear All In our Christian calendar, after Easter Sunday (when we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord lesus Christ) we look forward to the feast of Pentecost, typifying the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. On this particular day of Pentecost, the disciples were all in one accord, in one place. Nearly the same phrase is also noted in Acts 4:32 "Now the whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul". God is attracted by unity; it is the tool for evangelism too. It attracts people and invites God's presence. The disciples had the same aim - proclaiming the risen Christ and seeing people saved. Unity is where God's blessing dwells as affirmed by the Psalmist 133:1-3 "How very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity! It is like the precious oil on the head, running down upon the beard, on the beard of Aaron running down over the collar of his robes. It is like the dew of Hermon, which falls on the mountains of Zion. For there the Lord ordained his blessing, life forevermore".

I wonder what the disciples' conversations were about as they waited. A time of waiting can be an anxious period, but there is no doubt that, they were not just waiting but waiting in prayer and trust. They did not know exactly how the Gift of the Father would come.

The birth of the Church is marked by the coming of the Holy Spirit. There was a sound to hear (rushing mighty wind), a sight to see (divided tongues as of fire) and a miracle to experience (speaking with other tongues). From then onwards, the Spirit of God had been with the disciples. He took up residence in them. The disciples began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance. They were given a miracle to speak foreign languages which they never studied. However, speaking in tongues is just one sign of having the Spirit. The Spirit can manifest in many ways.

The coming of the Holy Spirit also formed believers into a Church. For by one Spirit we are all baptised into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free. The Holy Spirit dwells in us the moment we are saved. For us to be filled with the Spirit we must have a desire, a hunger. In the same book of Acts, it is recorded that after Peter and John had praved for those who were listening to them to receive the Holy Spirit, they placed their hands on them and they received the Holy Spirit. At Cornelius' house, where Peter was invited, the Holy Spirit came on all who heard the message as Peter was talking.

The word of our Lord Jesus Christ is being fulfilled John 16:7 "... I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Advocate will not come to you, but if I go, I will send him to you."



Parish Magazine Annual General Meeting 2024

Following formal approval of the minutes of the 2023 Annual General Meeting, the Hon Treasurer took the meeting through the duly examined 2023 accounts. A surplus from parish magazine activities of £3,521 had been offset by a deficit on support payments of £4,096, principally through the magazine funding the purchase of a new replacement printer/copier for use by nominated members of each of the PCCs. Consequently, total cash balances at the calendar year-end had dropped by £575 to £9,711.

The Editor reported that whilst he was still able to rely upon reports from a number of the local organisations and



clubs, others had fallen by the wayside post Covid 19. Their demise offered space for a variety of articles, poems and photographs to widen the appeal to subscribers. We continued to be indebted to the number of local established businesses and start-up organisations that supported the magazine by placing advertisements in each month's issue. The number of subscribers continued the gradual decline of previous years, which had been partially offset in 2023 by the magazine now being available in an on -line format.

Mike Wainwright, Editor, and Peter Chivers, Hon Treasurer and General Distributor, independently gave formal notice that they would not be seeking re-election to their respective roles at the end of the current calendar year. It was agreed by attendees that every effort should be made in the months ahead in seeking replacements to fill each of these positions in order that the magazine may continue beyond 2024.

The meeting closed with a vote of thanks to all of the distributors and sub-distributors for their ongoing in magazine loyalty getting the circulated each month to an appreciative readership. PMC / 08.04.14.

We have also joined the Plunkett Foundation. This will (already has) provide us with guidance and will reduce the fees to make the various applications.

We now need to complete the COF application. This is a much more

GARDENING in MAY

After a very unusual winter with many mild days and with the great deal of rain we have had, the gardening months ahead will be interesting – there may be some unexpected late frosts so keep an ear open for frost warnings and protect accordingly as much as one can.

The Spring bulbs were magnificent, keep 'deadheading' and note where there is overcrowding so that you can carefully move some and re-plant when they have fully died back. Meanwhile feed them with a 'general purpose' fertiliser and water this in. Many of us have lovely big 'Summer Pots' which will need careful planting, feeding and watering in the weeks ahead to keep them at their best. These big pots are so attractive and can be moved round in the garden. They need regular attention with watering and feeding but are so worthwhile!

Those of you who are tomato growers, whether in your greenhouses or a sheltered area, will be busy! Perhaps you will try out one of the many new varieties and it would be interesting to know of any special new ones you can recommend. I am sure there may well be threats of late frosts and all one can do is try and protect things as best one can. Keep an eye on early potatoes by just raking soil up if there is a serious frost warning and they soon recover.

If you have a Montana Clematis that is no longer flowering it will probably need some pruning to keep it under some sort of control. Also keep an eye on other vigorous climbing roses so they don't smother weaker plants.

Continue to feed all Tomatoes, Peppers and Aubergines with high-potash fertiliser every week

Try and mow established lawns once a week and treat weeds with a selective weedkiller. You will all be busy but enjoy your efforts too!

Essendon Nature Notes

It has become a bit of a tradition but fat. If you are lucky, you will also see every May I make the pilgrimage down the lovely summer falcon, the hobby, on a warm sunlit evening to the River taking advantage of this free lunch, Lea, as it flows alongside the Lower Hatfield Road, for the mayfly hatch. The picturesque little bridge on the road to Letty Green crosses the river and underneath the chub lie in wait. This spot below the bridge is a place of danger, the fish out of sight in the shadows, scarcely moving in the current. As the insects flutter and swoop they finally touch the water surface and, with a whoosh and a splash, the mayfly is gone.

The mayfly hatch is an event worth time to make sure you don't miss them witnessing, the river and surrounding this spring. fields alive with their elegance as they DC float and dance on the breeze. It is their sheer numbers that create the spectacle and for a week or so in May they are at their peak and the chub get

plucking the wings off in mid-air and gorging on the bounty.

Seen up close mayflies are rather beautiful creatures with their three long tail filaments and they are truly ancient, one of the first winged insects. They are, of course, famously shortlived, the word 'ephemeral' coming from the name of the genus, and have long been used as a motif in literature to remind us of the transience and fragility of human life. Perhaps it is
