#### Harvest

British harvest has been considered a reason for celebration for many years. I am told it was once a great festival with parades through out almost every village. Tradition would include making a corn doll out of the last harvested sheath as well as offering thanks for the end of the season. By then a successful harvest meant that people would be fed and looked after well. Poor harvest meant months of hardships or famine. Although some have lost the essence of the season. harvest is still important to many The other reason for counties. celebrating the season is to boost the domestic consumption of what is grown.

However, in our contexts Harvest season is celebrated in style by the three schools and also the Church and the community. The schools normally gather at their community Church with School staff, pupils, parents and governors to thank God for his goodness. The church will he decorated with beautiful autumn flowers and sometimes fruits. The services are normally led by school pupils guided by the staff. Different classes will display their works. It is also an amazing opportunity for pupils to do their reflections, poems, prayers of thanksgiving and singing harvest songs/hymns.

What is very touching is that, in their prayers the pupils will always remember those who are less privileged and give thanks for farmers and homes to live in. Most pupils also contribute towards Bishop's Harvest Appeal.

Church celebrates harvest by giving in kind and money. As an act of caring some donations goes to different charities and the foodbanks (some to help people in our communities). The talks in Church are of (Thankfulness). These Church services normally end with Harvest lunch or supper, where the Church and the community meet in fellowship and celebrate the event over food.

The story of the Ten lepers in Luke 17:11-19 is one of the stories which is sometimes referred to during the harvest talks. Where Jesus upon entering a certain village was met with ten lepers who were miraculously healed and only one came back to thank Jesus. Then Jesus asked him "Were not ten made clean? So where are the other nine? 18 Did none of them return to give glory to God...."

I wonder what the season means to us. Probably to some this is a time to personally look back and give thanks to God.

#### "CHURCH OF ENGLAND PARISHES CLOSE AT RECORD RATE"

According to a report in The Telegraph, Church of England parishes are closing at record rate. This works out as an average of 56 fewer parishes every year and marks the fastest rate of parish closures in 70 years.

Christians now account for less than half of England and Wales' population for the first time in census history, according to the latest Office for National Statistics (ONS) data, released in November.

Churchgoers failed to return to services following the pandemic. In 2021, the average Sunday church attendance was 509,200 across the country – up from 297,600 in 2020 but significantly down on the 707,100 recorded in 2019. In contrast, in 1995, the usual Sunday attendance was almost 1.1 million.

On Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2021, a gathering was held in St Bartholomew the Great, London's oldest parish church, to launch a campaign to "**Save the Parish**". The evening began with prayers for Archbishops Welby and Cottrell. A campaign was then launched with people committing pledging to resist plans to redirect money away from parochial ministry, and to resist any further centralisation of power and authority away from parishes and towards dioceses and the central church.





## **Gardening in October**

After the extraordinary warm weather of recent days it is time to take a deep breath and look carefully at your plans for the coming months and where to start?

There has been tremendous growth this year and, as I write this, it seems a good time to really see what has grown so much that it needs moving to a new position, also move what is not happy where it is. It is a very good time to move evergreen shrubs as long as long as the soil is moist and you must carefully dig the plant out with a really good root ball, firm it down well and plant it to the same depth as before, also carefully watering it in. Prune Blackberries and Loganberries and tie in new growth.

Divide perennials such as Hemerocallis (Daylily) and Delphiniums and replant. To prevent Rose Blackspot as much as you can, clear up fallen leaves and put them in your Green Bin and do some pre-winter pruning, cutting back Buddleias to prevent wind rock. Leave windfall apples for the birds but move them off the lawn and, whilst keeping it under control, leave Ivy as a useful late source of nectar for pollinators.

Keep 'dead-heading' your Dahlias as climate change has meant that October seems to be much milder than it was and they will continue to flower until the first real frost 'blackens' them. Be firm and cut right back removing the spent flowers and they will keep on trying to produce new ones.

Bring in your root vegetables lifting carrots and beetroot and carefully store them in a cool, dark frost-free place. Drain and store hoses and other garden equipment to protect them. Germander Speedwell
