Rector's Article.

Dear All Significant moments

During Jesus's time on earth mountains were a significant part of his earthly ministry. When He was about to start his ministry Jesus went into the desert to pray. While Jesus was in the desert the devil took Him to a very high mountain and showed Jesus all the kingdoms of the world and promised to give them to Jesus if Jesus would fall down and worship him (Matt 4: 8-9). Jesus declined.

It was on the Mountain, where Jesus taught about The Beatitudes. The Bible makes it clear that He sat down and began to teach his climbing followers.

Often Jesus went up to the mountain to pray (Matthew 14:23, Luke 6:12, John 6:15). He also performed miracles on the mountains. In Matthew 15:29-31, huge crowds came to Him bringing with them the sick, lame, etc to heal.

Mountains were solitary places and Jesus needed quiet places to pray, to commune with His Father, for guidance and strength. Mountains are places for revelation and healing. Besides the glory of God being seen, angels were also seen on Mount Transfiguration (Moses and Alijah talking to Jesus).

Today we have other solitary places besides mountains where we can withdraw to and seek God's face – Retreat Homes or an equivalent place. One of my significant experiences in my journey of faith was on a wet and windy Saturday in mid - July. I set off with other women to climb Mount

Snowdon. After a tricky ascent in difficult conditions, I reached the summit of Mount Snowdon. I was cold, wet and tired and as we climbed, the group that set out had split into smaller groups of just two, three people or more as different levels of stamina and fitness became apparent. I had determination and faith that I would get to the top. After a couple of hours, I reached the summit. As soon as I got to the summit with my friend we prayed fervently. The feeling I experienced there is indescribable, not something that is easy to describe particularly in those conditions.

I had been warned that the descent would be almost as difficult, with strong winds, driving rain, mist and tired legs. With God's determination, I started walking down, I saw God's faithfulness in his word Psalm 91: 11 - 12 (*For he will command his angels concerning you to guard you in all your ways; they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone*). I descended safely.

I learnt a great deal that day, about myself and my faith. I was in unfamiliar territory doing something that was quite different from anything I had done before, but I felt a great sense of achievement. With perseverance and faith in God you can succeed in any challenge you set for yourself. God's faithfulness will always be there to support and guide us. It was a significant moment.

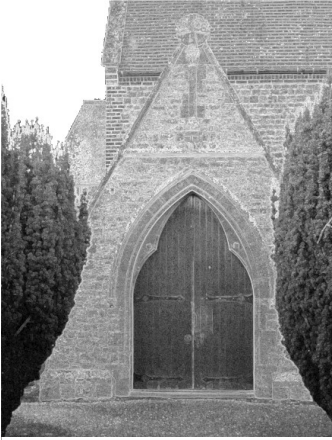
Community Interest Company

Community support behind a bright future for Baker Arms

News of the sudden departure of Baker Arms landlords, Martin and Bev, was met by a strong show of support from the village and beyond at the closing nights and a subsequent Parish Council meeting.

There has been a pub on the site for over 200 years. It one of the last true village amenities, the post office, shop and blacksmith having departed long ago

A working group has now been formed to explore options for a viable future for the pub.

Some 180 pubs in Britain have been successfully taken on by community groups, which is one model being considered. Some of these democratically run pubs have evolved to meet the needs of their patrons, incorporating cafes, shops and creative spaces.

Whatever the way forward, your support for the Baker Arms will be crucial to its success. We intend to hold a public engagement event in the Autumn; please stand by for updates and meanwhile any ideas or queries are welcome; please address them to me.

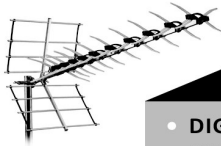

Gardening

I am writing this in a rather waterlogged early August and it will be interesting to see if I have to make major adjustments before it goes to print!

Once climbing roses have finished flowering start pruning using sharp secateurs to remove dead, diseased and dying bits and prune old stems to about 10cm above soil level. Prune back side shoots on the main stems to about three good healthy buds tying in new growth and spread it all out well. Lift any maincrop potatoes still in the ground before it gets any wetter to prevent slug damage and let them dry out well before you store them. Late flowering weeds are still setting so catch them!

cuttings of penstemons, salvias and verbena so that you are ready for any winter weather losses. Remember to take indoors any house plants that have been 'summering' outside before it gets too chilly. Plant Spring-flowering bulbs such as crocus, daffodil and iris but tulips can wait until November. Iris reticulata need very good drainage so try and get them going planting them quite thickly in gritty compost in a 'pan' then plant them out. Keep 'deadheading' your dahlias right back to the leaf joint every few days. With your summer raspberries cut this year's fruiting stems back to their base and tie in this year's new growth ready for fruit next year.

Essendon Nature Notes

It is perhaps because of the remarkable resurgence of our larger birds of prey, the peregrines, kites and buzzards, and further afield, ospreys and white-tailed eagles, that the kestrel has become increasingly overlooked. At one time this small falcon was the only bird of prey we were likely to see but now it seems the medieval hierarchy of falconry has had a renaissance: an eagle for an emperor, a peregrine for a prince, a merlin for a lady, a kestrel for a knave.

It might be low in the courtly pecking order and whilst it doesn't have the speed of a peregrine or the brute power of a goshawk, the kestrel has found a different way of mastering the air. Its ability to hover and hold its

head completely motionless as it fans out its tail is a magnificent adaptation for hunting over fields and margins. It is this sublime skill which captures our wonder and has justified its place in our literature. The Victorian poet Gerald Manley Hopkins, a few months before his ordination as a Jesuit priest, honoured the eponymous kestrel in his sonnet 'The Windhover', and in Hopkins's rejoicing in the glory of nature's creativity we can sense the confirmation of his faith:

"dapple-dawn-
drawn Falcon, in his riding
Of the rolling level underneath him
steady air, and striding
High there, how he rung upon the rein
of a wimpling wing
In his ecstasy!"

As usual, a kestrel has been scouting our adjoining field over the summer looking for the voles which form the majority of its diet. I don't know if it nested somewhere in the village this year but it often sits motionless on the telegraph wires surveying the scene and its small size means other birds are unperturbed by its quiet presence. They are truly elegant, exquisite creatures with dark spots on their smart brown plumage, the males distinguishable with their greyish-blue head. For me they are our finest bird of prey, so I am content to keep my place as a knave.

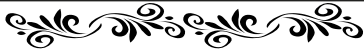
