ear All Sometimes in the history of Israel -(the apple of God's eve), there is a fearful account of how the nation forsook God and went into idolatry (Judges 11-12). Amenity to idolatry brought Israel into adoration and worship of idols. They abandoned Jehovah – the God of their fathers because of that Israel became powerless before the enemies - (the Philistines and the Ammonites).

Israel then cried out to God. God reminded Israel how He had delivered Israel as a nation in the past. God listens to our cry. We are also reminded of God's great heart of forgiveness and tenderness, like a father who is tender towards his children. Our misery calls forth His mercy. However, as Israel got ready to fight its enemies, there was a need for a mighty warrior who would lead the army into war.

There was a man called Jephthah, a Gileadite who was a mighty man of Valor and the son of an outcast. He was rejected by his own people, family and countrymen. After being rejected he wandered off far away from his own people to another land. When he got there because of what was in him, Jephthah became a leader of gangsters. The leaders of Israel came together and decided to seek for Jephthah and ask him to lead them into war against their enemies. They promised him recognition of headship if they win the war and defeated their enemy.

This story reminds us of our Lord Jesus Christ, when He was rejected by His own and led to the cross. Later, people called upon Him as their Saviour. In Matthew 21:42, Jesus said, *"Have you never read in the Scriptures: The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone."*.

Following the pattern of leaders in the book of Judges, Jephthah was the unlikely leader, his mother was not legally married, by the time he was recognised as a grown up, he was thrust out by his half - brother. However, God used Jephthah from a humble background to deliver Israel. He later became a Judge who presided over Israel for six years.

God discovers the marginalised Jephthah had his faith in God despite his background. He drew his strength from God. We also see his name cited alongside other great men of faith (Gideon, Samson,...) in Hebrews 11:32. These men had their faults but they were mightily used by God.


Save the Date! Essendon Residents and Friends. Saturday 7th September

Friends of the Baker Arms

A number of meetings and emails have been exchanged between FOBA and Tom McMullen. There is much common ground and McMs seem to be committed to retaining a public house in Bayford. There are still issues to sort out, not least the division of the building and car park between possible development and pub.

McM are likely to submit a planning application for the site. We hope the whole village will support this. None of the parties involved will get 100% of their desired outcome. We hope it will 'please most of the people, most of the time'.

Our COF (*Community Ownership Fund*) grant application has been put on hold due to the declaration of the election.

The COF grant will allow us to obtain government funding both for capital and revenue.

We have set up a Community Benefit Society, provisionally entitled '*The Bayford Community Benefit Society Limited*' (A catchy title you will agree), including the form specifying the rules under which the CBS will operate.

We have also joined the Plunkett Foundation. This will (already has)



provide us with guidance and will reduce the fees to make the various applications.

We have now almost completed the COF application. This is a much more involved process, and a number of decisions will have to be made beforehand.

The Right of Way Issue.

At the PC meeting on the 29th April, Oliver and Mike set out the proposed plans for the division of the Baker Arms site into the bit retained by McM for development and the bit that becomes the new Baker Arms.

We are still in discussion with McM, but are converging on a layout which will give FOBA (roughly) the righthand two thirds of the pub and half the car park.

After being pressed by the FOBA team,

and because of the possibility of a legal right of way, McM have conceded a two metre wide footpath down the north/left side of the car park, giving access from Ashendene Rd to Station Rd. This will not be a Public Footpath in the legal sense, but will be owned by the PC, and thus be a Permissive Footpath. This will safeguard this access for the future. We must emphasize that McM have made it clear that any attempt by us to apply for a legal RofW will mean 'the deal is off'.

We are very grateful to everyone who can forward to express their interest in testifying that they had used the pub as a footpath.

All this is subject to further discussion.

Isabel Hospice calls on local community to help buy vital medication for In-Patient Unit

Isabel Hospice, the hospice care charity serving eastern Hertfordshire, has launched an appeal to raise money to help buy essential medication so it can continue to deliver expert care to patients in its In -Patient Unit.

Only 30% of the medication used at the Isabel Hospice In-Patient Unit is funded by the NHS, meaning Isabel Hospice must raise a staggering £70,000 each year to pay for the rest.

The Medication Appeal features the story of local couple Rich and Katy. In 2021, aged just 38, Katy was diagnosed with cancer and sadly began to deteriorate rapidly with severe bouts of pain. Katy was later admitted to the Isabel Hospice In-Patient Unit where she was given a bespoke number of carefully balanced medications which had an immediate impact.

"Within days she was up, showering and washing her hair" said Rich "Our family were so surprised by how quickly she improved – it almost seemed like she was going to make a miraculous recovery."

"Isabel's care and careful medication plan meant we could enjoy all our 'lasts' together in the best way we could – with Katy present and free of pain."

The appeal is asking for donations to go towards medications that can provide pain relief, nausea relief, seizure relief, mental distress relief and more.

Manisha, a Clinical Nurse Specialist at Isabel Hospice commented: "A person could be struggling



with a whole range of other symptoms contributing to, or on top of their pain. Suddenly, the simplest of tasks can be overwhelming; things like showering, getting dressed, or taking a walk may be almost impossible."

"But when we manage to get these symptoms under control, it can make an enormous difference. Medication, alongside our incredible team of doctors and nurses, plays a crucial role in that care; without it there's only so much we can do to ease their journey."



GARDENING in JULY

Sitting here writing this on a cold miserable June afternoon I can only hope that this July Gardening article will be read under lovely sunshine and that your gardens are all catching up after a very odd and difficult Spring! With warm wet weather it is difficult to keep on top of things. Pests and diseases can rapidly multiply. Do not despair!

Mulch borders with any suitable organic matter available making sure that the ground under this mulch is sufficiently moist before doing this. Water thoroughly to be ready for dry warm spells.

Deadhead Roses to prolong their display pruning to lower outside buds which will clear the centre of the bushes. Give the roses a 'feed' using a high potash one to encourage strong shoots and more flowers later in the summer and spray regularly in good time using recommended treatment. Prune early flowering shrubs such as Philadelphus and Weigela if not already done. Remove cleanly any unwanted growth from the base of shrubs and trees and try for fun taking cuttings from Hydrangeas!

Disbud Dahlias if you want large blooms for local Shows etc. and carefully and strongly support these sturdy single flowering stems - you will need good stakes for this as they can be a bit 'top heavy'.

If your Dahlias are just a lovely show in your own gardens just carefully support them and remember that they do vary in height and colour! If buying new ones their pots will probably have not only their colour but also the individual expected height to help when you plant them out. (continued opposite)

GARDENING in JULY (concluded)

Keep an eye on bulbs from earlier Spring plantings that you have now lifted and 'heeled in'. Throw out any that show signs of rot, lay the remaining bulbs out singly to dry completely and store in trays in a cool dry place to be ready to be re-planted later.

Top up ponds in hot weather keeping a good eye that water levels are high enough and regularly make sure that there isn't too much weed there as oxygenating plants can take over.

Autumn flowering bulbs will soon be about and these can give such a lovely unexpected spectacular late Summer/Autumn show so look out for them!

Keep harvesting and enjoying your lovely flowers and vegetables!
