Long time ago, there were
two men (cupbearer and a
baker) who used to serve the king of
Egypt. It happened that they offended
the king and were thrown into prison.
One night, they each had a dream and
were worried because they could not
figure out the meanings.

Amongst them, there was a young man called Joseph (whom God had given the gift of interpretation of dreams). He was there because of circumstances beyond his control but God was with him. Joseph asked to hear the dreams. He gave them the meanings; the cupbearer's dream of the vine meant that Pharoah - the king would lift him back to his position of favour in three days. The baker's dream meant that he was not going to be retained to his position. What he said to them came true. Joseph said to the cupbearer "But remember me when it is well with you..." Genesis 40:14.

We see that Joseph did not wait for his situation to change for him to serve God. Despite the circumstances, he continued to serve others. This is encouraging. 2 Timothy 4:2 "...Preach the word; be prepared in season and out of season...".

When the cupbearer was released, he

went back to his position but forgot Joseph's plea. In the Gospels, Jesus also told his disciples at the last supper to remember him.

When the cupbearer was released, he forgot about Joseph. People may forget but God does not. Wait patiently for Him. It happened that after two years, Pharoah had a dream which all the magicians in Egypt could not interpret. It was then that the remembered cupbearer Joseph. Immediately, Joseph was called before Pharoah and God gave him the ability to interpret Pharoah's dream. From then on Joseph was trusted with tremendous responsibility by the king.

When we remember other people's and commitment, we strength to face the future with confidence. As a country we mark Remembrance Sunday, a memorial day to honour the sacrifice and the of British. Road Traffic Accidents in and around Essendon

Following yet another serious accident on the outskirts of the village on Sunday 6th October, involving two cars and necessitating the attendance of two fire engines, five ambulances, three police cars and two paramedics, the Parish Council is keen to involve our local politicians and the Highways Authority in a discussion to consider what action may be taken to reduce the speed limits and hazards on the B158. To start the discussion it is considered relevant to try to compile a database/log of all accidents and near misses on the B 158 between the Junction with Wildhill Road by the entrance to Camfield Place to the South and the Junction to Holwell Lane to the North. It is clear from various discussions that many more accidents occur than many of us realise but if the police aren't called and the vehicle is simply towed away, it is not logged on any official record. In the first instance it will be a historic record over the last few months and going forward it will hopefully be an up to date record of all accidents in the village and the outskirts and it will be this information that will help provide a base for discussions on what may be done to reduce or alleviate the problem.

I have agreed to help the Parish Council by compiling this database and therefore need details of any accidents or near misses that anyone has seen or experienced on the road in the area set out above and anything that is witnessed going forward. This is important to help make the roads safer for local residents. Please send any information, details or even photos to



Gardening in November

After the rather mixed weather we have had over recent months we have now reached the time to try and prepare our gardens for the winter months ahead and there are many practical ways we can do this and jobs that will help.

Take a quick look round and making a brief list of where to start and what must come first. Be practical over this whether it is a large or small area or even just your lovely pots.

Start by clearing away damaged and overgrown branches so you can really see what is underneath and dispose of them so that you have a clear picture and there is no question that leaves seem to be staying on trees later than they once did!

Divide hardy perennials and 'tidy' them up, risk re-planting good strong specimens but make sure that you also have other replacements with some sort of protection. With your Roses - cut back overgrown branches that may cause 'wind rock' but do this carefully.

Put 'chicken wire' over newly planted bulbs to deter squirrels and mice attacking them and put cloches over them for weather protection where necessary.

If you have any sort of water features thoroughly clear out fallen leaves etc.

Take hardwood cuttings of blackcurrants and gooseberries and these make lovely gifts to other gardening friends!

Saving Dahlias – last winter I made the mistake of leaving mine in place and lost several and this year I will take them up, let them dry out and then give them careful winter protection. Their replacements have flowered rather late this year but have been a picture and do make a brief note of their different heights for re-planting in the Spring!

We must remember our birds, how much pleasure they bring to us and work out an individual sensible feeding plan that we can manage safely particularly in hard weather – for those more 'housebound' they are great joy but don't fall!
