Rector's Article.

Being thankful is morally excellent and a virtue. We are approaching the season of Harvest in our Anglican Liturgical calendar. When we show our gratitude for what God has done in our lives.

Biblically, this is also demonstrated in the story of the ten lepers (Luke 17:11 -19). The Lord Jesus was travelling towards Jerusalem along borders of Samaria and Galilee. When approached the village, ten men who were lepers saw him. As they had the leprosy condition they could not come near Jesus. The condition prevented them to draw close. No matter their physical distance, they were not going to let their miracle pass or the distance which separated them be a barrier to their breakthrough. They called out in a loud voice "Jesus, Master have pity on us". They cried out for Him to heal them. Call out to **Iesus!**

Jesus heard and saw them. He rewarded their faith and told them to go and show themselves to the Priests. This meant that when they reached the Priest they would have been healed from leprosy. The Priest had no power to heal but he was designated to pronounce them clean. Being obedient to the words of Jesus, the lepers started to walk to the

Priests. As they went, they were cleansed from the disease.

They all had faith because they all obeyed the Word and went. One of them, seeing that he was healed, he lesus. went back to thank Interestingly. this one was Samaritan, the others were Jews. When he got to where Jesus was, he fell on his face, at the feet of Iesus, the posture of worship, and thanked Jesus. However, Jesus asked if it were not true that ten were cleansed but only one had returned to give thanks. None of them had come back to give glory to God. Turning to the Samaritan Jesus said "Rise and go, your faith has made vou well". The grateful will inherit Christ's true riches.

Jesus meets and blesses us when we give thanks. The nine were healed from leprosy but the one who came back was saved from sin.

In the Old Testament, under the law, Israel was not allowed to strip the fields clean when harvesting, they were to leave some of the grain as gleaning for the needy, strangers, the fatherless and the windows. This is pictured by Ruth in the fields of Boaz (Ruth 2). Boaz went further to invite Ruth to eat with his workers and instructed the reapers to leave extra grain for her on purpose.

Local Solicitors Donate Will Writing Services Throughout October to Raise Funds for Isabel Hospice

From October 1st and October 31st 2024, multiple local solicitors and will writers have agreed to write basic single or mirror wills free of charge, in return for a suggested donation to the Hertfordshire based hospice care charity, Isabel Hospice.

60% of people in UK do not yet have a will written and writing a will is the only way to be sure that your wishes are followed after your death and that the people and causes you care about are still supported when you are no longer here.

Isabel Hospice last ran the Make a Will Month scheme in March, and with the support of local solicitors raised almost £9,000 to help Isabel Hospice care for patients and their families in eastern Hertfordshire affected by life-limiting-illness.

To take part, all you have to do is find your nearest participating solicitor online at isabelhospice.org.uk/MakeAWill and give them a call or email to make an appointment.

Suggested donations to Isabel Hospice are £120 for a single basic will and £175 for a pair of mirror basic wills.

Appointments are limited and allocated on a first come, first served basis so it is advisable to contact your chosen solicitor as soon as possible.



It's part of a manual gearbox from a series 1 BMC car. The unit engages 1st and 2nd gear by moving the large ring up or down with the gear lever. This ring presses against the gear to be engaged so that they travel at the same speed and therefore do not crunch.

It was invented by Ferdinand Porsch in 1952.

Before this it was necessary to double declutch in order the speed up or slow down the next gear. MW

Gardening in October

2024 has been a strange year in our gardens and lessons can be learnt from how our different gardens, whether large or small, have coped and maybe we can take this opportunity look at things from all sorts of fresh angles.

Just looking round here as I write this, I can only say that in my own garden I am wondering whether some of my Dahlias are ever going to actually flower! They look very healthy and full of bud and two new ones have finally gently burst slowly into flower. I made the mistake last winter in not digging them up, letting them dry out properly and wintering them with protection!

I am also enjoying what has done well this summer in other peoples gardens and learning from them their tips and am continuing to do so into this Autumn - we gardeners never stop learning!

I remember last year seeing a beautiful Acer Palmatum, a Japanese maple, which is deciduous with foliage that turns first to a golden orange, then a deeper orange and finally red in late Autumn and it was a wonderful spectacle. A Rosa rugosa, also often known as as the 'hedgehog' rose'. This also has pretty pink flowers followed by large red hips in the Autumn and it also gives a wonderful lasting display. Another lovely Autumnal tree is the Sorbus pseudohupehensis, Pink Pagoda, which is in fact a deciduous Crab Apple tree with edible fruits!

Create colourful container displays of Autumn foliage and flowers and position them where they can be seen - perhaps on a Patio or outside the Front door! They can be easy to create, not too costly, easy to put together and probably, with a bit of luck, you will be able to integrate these plants into your borders for the years ahead. Chose a large container with good drainage holes in the base, fill it up with peat-free multi- purpose compost and plant the biggest plants first. Then evenly plant trailing plants and fill any gaps with smaller upright ones giving a well-balanced full display. Make sure you plant all the plants firmly, fully top up the compost and water well. 'Dead head' regularly to keep it flowering as long as possible and give it a liquid feed every five weeks or so to balance the 'peat-free' compost and to keep the plants healthy. Continue to remove any faded or damaged leaves and it should be a great and cheerful success!
