#### Rector's Article.

ear All
In the presence of the Father there is protection and joy.
God is our Father.

A parable is an earthly story with a heavenly meaning. In Luke 15:11-32 there is a parable of a lost son. In that story God is depicted as a certain Father/ man who had two sons. The younger son is known as a prodigal son. The younger son became tired, weary of his Father and decided to leave the household. In that parable the vounger son could not wait for his Father to die so that he could ask for his portion of inheritance, but he went to his Father and asked for his portion - ahead of time. After getting his portion the younger son set off to another far country.

When he reached that country he spent his money freely and in sinful pleasures. He had moved away from the Father's presence and moved to a far away country. As soon as his funds were finished, he went into a severe depression, fear gripped him. There was famine in the land and the vounger son became a destitute. In that state. he found himself employment as a feeder of swine, a job that would have been most distasteful even to an average Jew. As he watched the pigs eating, he thought "They even have more to eat than I have". There was no one to help him. He had moved from the presence of his Father back home.

In this far away country, the prodigal son lost everything he had. He lost his joy. When we move away from the presence of the Lord, we lose the joy of salvation. He became open to vultures. Away from the Father there was no protection or sustenance. We also see that God our Father is the only one who makes us rich.

However, in that state of destitute the prodigal son remembered that his Father back home had servants. He remembered that even those servants at his Father's household were living far better than him. He thought that those servants had enough food to eat. As he thought of that he decided to go back to his Father. In repentance he went.

On the other end, the Father was waiting, from when he went away, he kept hoping to see his son coming back one day. God will fulfil our expectations. One day the Father saw his son coming. The Father ran and kissed him. The son made his confession in his Father's presence, acknowledging his sin and seeking pardon. Before he finished, the Father interrupted by asking the slaves to put the best robe on his son, a ring and sandals on his feet. As if that was not enough, the Father ordered a feast to celebrate the return.

The younger son symbolises the repentant person. Let us remain in the presence of God who is our Father. There is protection and peace. David said in Psalm 122: *I was glad when they said me, let us go to the house of the LORD*". *In His presence there is fullness of joy.* Psalm 16:11.



#### **GARDENING in SEPTEMBER**

September is somehow the beginning of the gentle end of Summer and the first promise of Autumn and all that that brings. I took the risk this last year of not bringing my Dahlias inside over winter and the earlier summer months seemed sure to make me look a fool until suddenly they started to appear again - their flowering season will be rather late but they look fine and healthy and I won't risk doing that again!

September marks the start of next Spring's bulb season and many will now be available in Nurseries and Garden Centres. Crocus, miniature daffodils and all sorts of new bulbs are coming to the market, are wonderful value and will reappear and multiply in the years ahead. Order them now from specialist nurseries or visit local Garden Centres. Just check what sort of position they need and start planting. Tulips are best delayed until next month before putting in.

Take some time to tidy up beds, containers and borders and keep an eye open for leaf-spot infections, grey mould, mildews, rusts and other problems so take out your secateurs and clear the worst of that and 'bin' it. The plants themselves will look much better and you will be helping reduce further problems in the months ahead. I am afraid that slugs and snails will be out in force enjoying decomposing plant material and damper weather so keep on top of them.

The best time for planting new 'woody' trees and shrubs and also Roses is fast approaching so take time to look round and see what new climbers, shrubs and trees would look good and exactly where in your garden. Thoroughly weed and clear the areas needed for these 'new arrivals' so that they can go straight in. The ground will still be warm enough and improved by autumn rainfall so get planting!
